

**RESOLUTION NO. 748 -2010, AMENDING THE 2010
ADOPTED OPERATING BUDGET TO ACCEPT AND
APPROPRIATE 100% FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS PASSED
THROUGH THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF
HEALTH FOR THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND
REINVESTMENT ACT (ARRA) EARLY INTERVENTION
ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Health Services has awarded 100% Federal grant funds to the Department of Health Services for the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Early Intervention Administration Program in the amount of \$678,425 for the period 10/01/09-09/30/11; and

WHEREAS, these funds will assist with the conversion from the Kids Integrated Data System (KIDS) to the New York Early Intervention System (NYEIS); and

WHEREAS, this conversion will involve overtime, purchase of supplies and computer equipment, hiring of temporary clerical staff for data entry into the new system and training for Early Intervention providers, families and staff; and

WHEREAS, these funds were not included in the 2010 Suffolk County Operating Budget; and

WHEREAS, these funds are 100% Federally funded; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer be and hereby are authorized to accept and appropriate \$678,425 in grant funds as follows:


