

**RESOLUTION NO. 886 -2010, LOCATING A POLICE
SUBSTATION IN HUNTINGTON STATION**

WHEREAS, there has been a surge in street violence, drug dealings, and gang activity in Huntington Station in the past several years; and

WHEREAS, the severity of the crime problem in the Huntington Station community led the Huntington School Board to take the extraordinary step of removing the students from the Jack Abrams Intermediate School; and

WHEREAS, the efforts of school, town, and County officials to stem violent crime in Huntington Station have so far proven insufficient; and

WHEREAS, a police substation was located in Huntington Station from 1996 until 2006; and

WHEREAS, re-establishing a police substation in the general vicinity of the Jack Abrams School would send a strong signal that the County of Suffolk is serious about stopping crime in Huntington Station; and

WHEREAS, re-establishing a police substation would heighten County police presence, deter crime, and help make the streets of Huntington Station safe for community residents; now, therefore be it


1st RESOLVED, that the Director of the Division of Real Property Acquisition and Management is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to locate a facility to house a police substation in the general vicinity of the Jack Abrams School in Huntington Station; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Director of the Division of Real Property Acquisition and Management shall report back to this Legislature on her findings and recommend a location for the police substation within thirty (30) days from the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
