

RESOLUTION NO. 916 -2010, DIRECTING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO STUDY THE SHOTSPOTTER® GUNSHOT LOCATION SYSTEM

WHEREAS, Huntington Station and other communities in Suffolk County have experienced a spike in gun crimes; and

WHEREAS, advances in technology have led to the development of acoustic surveillance systems that can quickly detect and pinpoint the location of gunfire; and

WHEREAS, municipalities across the country, including the County of Nassau, have utilized the ShotSpotter® Gunshot Location System to reduce gunfire and combat violent crime; and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Police Department has utilized asset forfeiture monies to pay for the ShotSpotter® Gunshot Location System; and

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk should utilize every tool available to combat crime in communities that are beset by gun violence; now, therefore be it

1st **RESOLVED**, that the Commissioner of the Suffolk County Police Department is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to study the feasibility of implementing the ShotSpotter® Gunshot Location System in Suffolk County and deliver its findings to the County Legislature and the County Executive; and be it further

2nd **RESOLVED**, that the Police Department study and report should determine and recommend which communities would most benefit from the ShotSpotter® Gunshot Location System; and be it further


3rd **RESOLVED**, that the Police Department study and report should determine the cost of deploying the ShotSpotter® Gunshot Location System in targeted areas and address whether there are sufficient monies in their asset forfeiture accounts to purchase and implement ShotSpotter®; and be it further

4th **RESOLVED**, that the Police Department shall deliver a copy of its report to the County Executive and to each member of the County Legislature within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

5th **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
