

**RESOLUTION NO. 79 -2011, APPROPRIATING FUNDS  
IN CONNECTION WITH CONSTRUCTION OF A SKATE  
PARK IN SAYVILLE (CP 7113)**

**WHEREAS**, a skate park facility would offer a recreational opportunity for youth to participate in a positive past time activity; and

**WHEREAS**, youth have found informal ways to participate in skateboarding that has caused damage to their communities; and

**WHEREAS**, a skate park facility would provide youth with an appropriate facility to engage in skateboarding activities that would reduce the incidence of destruction of community property; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the Legislature to construct a skate park in Sayville; and

**WHEREAS**, there are sufficient funds within the 2011 Capital Budget and Program to cover the cost of planning and construction for said work under Capital Project 7113; and

**WHEREAS**, that this Legislature, by resolution of even date herewith, has authorized the issuance of \$250,000 in Suffolk County Serial Bonds; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 471-1994, as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006 established the use of a priority ranking system, implemented in the Adopted 2011 Capital Budget, as the basis for funding capital projects such as this project; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that it is hereby determined that this project, with a priority ranking of thirty-one (31) is eligible for approval in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 471-1994 as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the proceeds of \$250,000 in Suffolk County Serial Bonds be and they hereby are appropriated as follows:

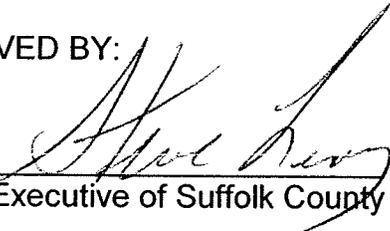
