

**RESOLUTION NO. 805 -2011, AMENDING THE 2011
OPERATING BUDGET TO TRANSFER FUNDS TO THE
SUFFOLK COUNTY ASSIGNED COUNSEL DEFENDER
PLAN**

WHEREAS, Suffolk County is obligated to provide counsel to persons charged with a crime or who are entitled to counsel pursuant to certain sections of the Family Court Act, the Corrections Law, the Surrogate's Court Procedure Act and the Mental Hygiene Law; and

WHEREAS, the County contracts with the Suffolk County Bar Association, which administers the Suffolk County Assigned Counsel Defender Plan to provide legal services pursuant to County Law Article 18-B; and

WHEREAS, the 2011 Adopted Operating Budget does not include sufficient funds to pay the attorneys that perform this mandated function; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Legislature to provide an additional \$500,000 for the Suffolk County Assigned Counsel Defender Plan; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-31 (G) of the Suffolk County Charter now allows amendment of the County Operating Budget by County Legislators four times during the fiscal year as long as the amendment reduces, lowers, terminates or cancels appropriations; abolishes positions of employment; terminates contract agencies; terminates or reduces the size of County programs or departments, or makes transfers of appropriations that are offset by reductions in other programs; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the 2011 County Operating Budget is hereby amended as follows and that the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer be and hereby are authorized to transfer the following funds and authorizations.

Dear Presiding Officer Lindsay and Members of the Legislature:

I am returning herein **RESOLUTION NO. 805 – 2011, AMENDING THE 2011 OPERATING BUDGET TO TRANSFER FUNDS TO THE SUFFOLK COUNTY ASSIGNED COUNSEL DEFENDER PLAN**; vetoed in its entirety.

This resolution transfers \$500,000 in appropriations from the Department of Public Works to pay for costs associated with the Suffolk County Assigned Counsel Defender Plan, often referred to as the 18-b program. The need for these funds was created by Legislative action in the 2011 Operating Budget process, whereby the Legislature used the recommended funding provided for the 18-b program as an offset for a Legislative spending initiative, which resulted in a rolling program deficit.

The County Attorney had warned the Legislature not to reduce the line item. The Legislature insisted that the Executive had miscalculated the amount needed to fully fund the program and they took this needed money to fund legislature projects - thereby creating a hole in the budget. Now that the Legislature concedes that it overdrew those funds, it is seeking to replenish the line by taking money from the red light camera line that is slated to help balance the 2012 budget.

Enactment of this resolution will create a half-million dollar hole in the 2012 Operating Budget, as the appropriations which are being transferred from Public Works are shown as not being spent in 2011 in the 2012 Recommended Budget. This helps create the projected 2011 General Fund fund balance which rolls to 2012 and contributes to a General Fund tax freeze next year.

It is fiscally irresponsible for the Legislature to create a budget hole like this to address prior Legislative budget actions. If the Legislature desires to add \$500,000 to the Assigned Defender Program in 2011, its members should identify specific spending cuts from Legislative projects that were paid for out of the raiding of this legal fund in 2011.

For these reasons, I strongly urge the Legislature to sustain my veto of this resolution.

An override of this veto will in essence increase spending at a time the Legislature is claiming the budget is out of balance.
