RESOLUTION NO. 71 -2012, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING \$248,472 IN 100% FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS AWARDED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE UNDER THE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT TO SUFFOLK COUNTY DEPARTMENTS OF PROBATION, POLICE, SHERIFF, SOCIAL SERVICES AND DISTRICT ATTORNEY

WHEREAS, Suffolk County has applied for and has been approved to receive Federal Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant funds in the amount of \$248,472 from the U.S. Department of Justice; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County Departments of Probation, Police, Sheriff, Social Services and the District Attorney cooperatively submitted the grant application through the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council; and

WHEREAS, on, June 20th 2011 the County's Criminal Justice Coordinating Council provided the required public notice on all funding requests under said grant and after such notice it was the recommendation of the Council to approve all such funding requests; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Integrated Financial Management System will be setup with expense units 001-PRO-3199, 115-POL-3627, 001-SHF-3159, 001-DIS-1150, and 001-DSS-6024 with the title for all to be BYRNE JAG PROGRAM for the segregation of all expenditures to be reimbursed under this grant; and

WHEREAS, the Probation Department has requested \$46,000 to provide psychological assessments of offenders with serious mental illness and co-occurring disorders conducted by consultant psychologists. These assessments will be used by the mental health court and probation mental health unit in sentencing decisions and overall offender management; and

WHEREAS, the Probation Department has requested \$30,000 to help support costs for Parents for Megan's Law to help support agency crime victim advocates who educate victims about their rights, the criminal justice process and provide comprehensive victim support services including claims assistance, crisis intervention, telephone and in-person counseling, follow-up, criminal justice advocacy, personal advocacy, information and referrals and other social services; and

WHEREAS, the Probation Department has requested \$10,000 to help support the Pederson-Krag Center in assisting clients with criminal records looking for employment through the services provided by a Job Coach who would administer screening tools to assess skills and abilities of each person, role play job interviewing skills, teach clients what their rights are as people and assist with child support issues; and

WHEREAS, the Probation Department has requested \$8,472 to help support Prison Families Anonymous, in providing support group for families who have a loved one in the criminal or juvenile justice system; and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney has requested \$46,000 to support partial salary for a detective investigator for the Heroin Drug Task Force, which is currently, and will remain budgeted in the 001-DIS-1150; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has requested \$41,000 to provide overtime salaries for the Gang Resistance Education and Training (G.R.E.A.T.) program for 175 days; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has requested \$5,000 to provide for the annual gang intelligence seminar to law enforcement personnel; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has requested \$41,000 for the purchase of Pre-Screening Breath Test Units – The Breath Test Unit needs updated alcohol pre-screening units. The current SD2 units are past their useful lifespan and further repair is not cost effective. The unit proposes to purchase Alco-Sensor FST units at a cost per unit of \$309. In addition, repair and testing supplies for the unit to maintain the equipment would total about \$521. There are currently 431 PBT devices in SCPD inventory, of which 236 are the outdated SD2s. A proposal to replace 131 of them with Alco-Sensors would enable them to begin to replace units in the precincts at a cost of \$40,479. Total cost for this project is \$41,000; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department has requested \$5,000 to provide overtime costs for the Hate Crimes Unit to conduct approximately 66 hours of community presentations; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Social Services has requested \$16,000 to provide daily stipends of \$25 to court-appointed guardians for incapacitated adults who do not have family members or who cannot afford to hire a guardian person; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant award period is from October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2014; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Executive is authorized to execute any Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice, as necessary, to secure said grant funds; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that nothing contained herein shall be construed as obligating or committing the County of Suffolk to continue the employment of individuals filling the positions created by this resolution at the conclusion of the grant which provided funding for such position created by said grant; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to accept and appropriate said grant funds in the amount of \$248,472 as follows:




