

**RESOLUTION NO. 243-2012, ESTABLISHING A SIX- MONTH
PILOT PROGRAM TO OPTIMIZE USE OF SHOTSPOTTER
TECHNOLOGY**

WHEREAS, crime and gun violence are significant public safety issues in Suffolk County and throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, the County installed ShotSpotter technology in several communities to improve policing and improve the likelihood of apprehending shooters; and

WHEREAS, one of the communities which has been equipped with ShotSpotter, Huntington Station, also has a Business Improvement District ("BID") which maintains a network of 36 security video cameras, with live video feeds available through secure software online; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Police Department ("SCPD") currently has access to the BID security cameras at its headquarters in Yaphank; the BID has offered to allow the SCPD access to their security video feeds at the Second Precinct and will provide at least one laptop with this capability preinstalled; and

WHEREAS, a pilot program should be established to coordinate use of the BID security cameras with ShotSpotter technology to obtain additional information about the scene of a shooting while police officers respond; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Police Department is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to establish a six (6) month pilot program in the Second Precinct using access to the Huntington Station BID security camera feed in conjunction with alerts from ShotSpotter; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Police Department is further directed, upon receipt of a ShotSpotter alert from the Huntington Station system, to locate the BID camera nearest to the location provided by ShotSpotter, examine the live video feed of that camera and relay any pertinent information that may aid responding officers; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that the Police Department shall evaluate this pilot program six (6) months after implementation to determine its effectiveness and shall issue a written report to the County Executive and each member of the County Legislature containing its findings and recommendations to cease, expand or continue the program in its current form; and be it further


4th RESOLVED, that the written report shall be provided within sixty (60) days after the pilot program ends; and be it further

5th RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations,

rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
