

RESOLUTION NO. 771 -2012, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING A GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,170,580 FROM THE NEW YORK STATE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES FOR THE OPERATION IMPACT IX TASK FORCE WITH 90.19% SUPPORT

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services has made \$1,170,580 in State funding available to Suffolk County to continue efforts to reduce violent crime, particularly gun-related crimes, burglary and robbery; and

WHEREAS, said grant funds are to be distributed between the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office, the Suffolk County Police Department, the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office and the Probation Department; and

WHEREAS, the operational period of the program will be from July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, \$434,864 in permanent salary expense, \$108,816 in fringe benefits and \$20,000 in Special Services of the District Attorney's Office funding for the program has been included in the 2012 Suffolk County Operating Budget and in the 2013 Operating Budget Request; and

WHEREAS, \$563,680 in revenue of the District Attorney's Office funding for the program has been included in the 2012 Suffolk County Operating Budget and in the 2013 Operating Budget Request; and

WHEREAS, \$606,900 in said grant funds have not been included in the 2012 Suffolk County Operating Budget; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Comptroller and County Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to accept and appropriate said grant funds as follows:



4th **RESOLVED**, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute the grant agreement between Suffolk County and the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services.
