**RESOLUTION NO. 207 -2013, GRANTING A TEMPORARY
WAIVER OF SUFFOLK COUNTY RESIDENCY
REQUIREMENTS FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF KATHERINE
DANIEL**

WHEREAS, Katherine Daniel will be employed as an Assistant to the Commissioner in the Suffolk County Department of Labor, Licensing and Consumer Affairs; and

WHEREAS, Katherine Daniel is a resident of the Borough of Brooklyn; and

WHEREAS, Katherine Daniel has a Master's Degree in City Planning, concentrating in Regional Economic Development from the University of California, Berkley; and

WHEREAS, Katherine Daniel was recruited for this position based on her many years of experience and skills in energy efficiency, workforce development and re-entry; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County will benefit from the unique skill set of Katherine Daniel; now, therefore be it

1st **RESOLVED**, that pursuant to Section C6-3(B)(4)(2) of the Suffolk County Charter, Katherine Daniel, Assistant to the Commissioner in the Suffolk County Department of Labor, Licensing and Consumer Affairs, is hereby granted a temporary waiver from the residency requirements set forth in Sections C6-3(B)(2) and (3) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER, but the waiver granted herein shall not exceed one (1) year from the commencement date of her employment; and be it further

2nd **RESOLVED**, This Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Sections 617.5(c) (20) and/or (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.
