

**RESOLUTION NO. 728 -2013, NAMING THE PINE BARRENS
TRAIL CENTER AFTER RAYMOND P. CORWIN**

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2010, Raymond Corwin died suddenly at the young age of 56; and

WHEREAS, before his untimely death, Raymond Corwin played an instrumental and influential role in protecting Suffolk's open spaces, environment and underground aquifer; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Corwin was profoundly involved in the Central Pine Barrens protection effort and his knowledge of the Central Pine Barrens was boundless based on his life experience and passion for the environment; and

WHEREAS, Raymond Corwin was the first Executive Director of the Central Pine Barrens Joint Planning and Policy Commission; and

WHEREAS, additionally, Mr. Corwin was on the Board of the Long Island Pine Barrens Society and the Long Island Greenbelt Trail Conference; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Corwin also served as trustee and Chairman of the Suffolk County Parks Board of Trustees for many years and he was instrumental in helping to create and maintain many trails in Suffolk County parkland, including the Pine Trail Preserve, the Paumanok Path and the Brookhaven Trail; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County wishes to recognize the lasting achievements and legacy of Raymond Corwin; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that, the Pine Barrens Trail Center located on Eastport-Manor Road in Manorville be named the "Raymond P. Corwin Pine Barrens Trail Center"; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed, pursuant to Section 8-2(W) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER, to take all actions necessary and appropriate to effectuate this naming and dedication; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
