RESOLUTION NO. 719 -2013, APPROVING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF RICHARD L. CRESCENZO AS A MEMBER OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL, RESIDENTIAL SEPTIC TANK/SEWER DRAIN TREATMENT, BACTERIA ADDITIVES AND MAINTENANCE BOARD

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 17-1971 authorized the creation of a five member Suffolk County Commercial, Industrial, Residential Septic Tank/Sewer Drain Treatment, Bacteria Additives and Maintenance Board; and

WHEREAS, members of the Suffolk County Commercial, Industrial, Residential Septic Tank/Sewer Drain Treatment, Bacteria Additives and Maintenance Board; are appointed by the County Executive, subject to legislative approval; and

WHEREAS, the term of office of Richard L. Crescenzo has expired; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive has re-nominated Richard L. Crescenzo to serve as a member of the Suffolk County Commercial, Industrial, Residential Septic Tank/Sewer Drain Treatment, Bacteria Additives and Maintenance Board; now, therefore be it

1st **RESOLVED**, that the reappointment of Richard L. Crescenzo of Medford, New York, as a member of the Suffolk County Commercial, Industrial, Residential Septic Tank/Sewer Drain Treatment, Bacteria Additives and Maintenance Board, for a term of office expiring December 7, 2013, is hereby approved, said reappointment having been made pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 563 of the Suffolk County Code; and be it further

2nd **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
