

**RESOLUTION NO. 997-2013, ADDING A REPRESENTATIVE
OF SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO THE
LONG ISLAND COMMISSION ON AQUIFER PROTECTION**

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 805-2013 created the Long Island Commission on Aquifer Protection ("LICAP"); and

WHEREAS, various organizations dedicated to the protection of the environment and groundwater will serve as members of LICAP; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Soil and Water Conservation District should be represented on LICAP; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the 5th RESOLVED clause of Resolution No. 805-2013 is hereby amended to read as follows:

5th RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Executive, the Presiding Officer of the Suffolk County Legislature, the Minority Leader of the Suffolk County Legislature, the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works, the Commissioner of Parks, Recreation and Conservation, and the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Planning, or their representatives, and the Suffolk County Soil and Water Conservation District, shall serve as ex-officio members of the LICAP, but shall not be entitled to vote, and a representatives from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the United States Geologic Survey and the Long Island Groundwater Research Institute shall be invited to serve as ex-officio members; and be it further

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2nd RESOLVED, that all other terms and conditions of Resolution No. 805-2013 shall remain in full force and effect; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
