**RESOLUTION NO. 1163 -2013, NAMING THE NORTH COUNTY COMPLEX IN HONOR OF WILLIAM J. LINDSAY**

**WHEREAS**, on September 11, 2013, the Suffolk County Legislature lost its sitting Presiding Officer, William J. Lindsay, who battled mesothelioma for almost 2 years; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Lindsay was the longest serving Presiding Officer in the history of the Suffolk County Legislature; and

**WHEREAS**, in his 12 years as a County Legislator, including 8 years as Presiding Officer, Mr. Lindsay worked tirelessly to meet the needs of County residents and build consensus among fellow lawmakers; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Lindsay was known as the "Lion of the Legislature" because he fought tirelessly to maintain the Legislature as an independent, co-equal branch of County government; and

**WHEREAS**, William Lindsay led the way in establishing the County's red light camera program, preserving the Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum, strengthening the County's ethics code and reforming the County's process for procuring consultant services; and

**WHEREAS**, prior to his tenure as an elected official, Mr. Lindsay was a union leader for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 25, and a staunch advocate for all working men and women in Suffolk County; and

**WHEREAS**, in recognition of his years of service and leadership in the County of Suffolk, the County should rename the North County Complex in honor of William J. Lindsay; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that the North County Complex on Veterans Highway in Hauppauge be named the "William J. Lindsay County Complex"; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, that the naming shall be effective as of March 12, 2014; and be it further

**3rd RESOLVED**, that the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed, pursuant to § 8-2(W) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER, to take all actions necessary and appropriate to effectuate this naming and dedication; and be it further

**4th RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on

Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
