**RESOLUTION NO. 1109 -2013, EXTENDING THE LIFE OF
DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION AND DOWNTOWN
BEAUTIFICATION GRANT PROJECTS**

WHEREAS, the Downtown Revitalization and Downtown Beautification and Renewal Grant projects were given a Period of Probable Usefulness (PPU) life of five years when adopted; and

WHEREAS, the type of projects approved and specified include parking lot improvements, street lighting, sidewalk installation, pavers, improvements to downtown buildings and accommodations; and

WHEREAS, these projects have been reviewed and should be assigned a PPU life of fifteen years allowing more time to issue authorized funds; and

WHEREAS, this resolution authorizes the current Downtown Revitalization and the Downtown Beautification projects PPU life to be extended from five to fifteen years; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, the County Legislature approves the following projects PPU life be extended from five to fifteen years:
