RESOLUTION NO. 657 -2014, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING FUNDING FOR THE DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT INITIATIVE (DEI) FROM THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR FOR THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT (WIA) PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Labor (NYSDOL) has awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,043,565 to the Suffolk County Department of Labor, Licensing and Consumer Affairs to provide case management services to individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, this grant is funded by the New York State Department of Labor, for the express purpose of providing case management services to individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, this grant funding covers the period October 1, 2013 through January 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, these funds have not been included in the 2014 Adopted Operating Budget; and

WHEREAS, these funds are 100% State funded; and

WHEREAS, 2 full time Neighborhood Aides and 1 full time Labor Technician will be created in this program; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute related agreements; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to accept and appropriate said grant funds as follows:

5th **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”), Environmental Conservation Law Article 8, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action, pursuant to Volume 6 of New York Code of Rules and Regulations (“NYCRR”) Section 617.5 (c) (25) and (27), in that the resolution concerns purchase of furnishings, equipment and supplies, other than land, radioactive material, pesticides, herbicides or other hazardous materials, and adoption of a local legislative decision in connection with the same; as a Type II action, the Legislature has no further responsibilities under SEQRA.
