**RESOLUTION NO. 1016-2014, AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC WORKS TO ENTER INTO GENERAL PROPERTY USE AGREEMENTS WITH PRIVATE PROPERTY OWNERS FOR PURPOSES OF INSTALLING BUS SHELTERS**

**WHEREAS**, the County of Suffolk operates a bus transit system within the boundaries of Suffolk County for use and benefits of residents and visitors to the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the County maintains and owns numerous bus shelters for the convenience of the ridership; and

**WHEREAS**, the size and desired locations for the bus shelters does not always allow the County to install the shelters on the road right-of-way; and

**WHEREAS**, installations on private property do not take place on the property of single family residences but, rather, on property of commercial property or apartment complexes; and

**WHEREAS**, the process of installing bus shelters on such properties could be expedited through administrative handling by the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup> RESOLVED**, that the Commissioner of Public Works, be and hereby is authorized to execute an agreement with the private property owner of any commercial property or with the owner of any property upon which multi-family housing is provided for the purpose of constructing, installing and maintaining a bus shelter; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup> RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.59(c)(20) and (27) of Title 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-109 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. Furthermore, in accordance with Section 1-4(A)(1)(d) of the Suffolk County Charter and Section 279-5(C)(4) of the Suffolk County Code, the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality is directed to prepare and circulate all appropriate notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
