RESOLUTION NO. 901-2014, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING 100% FEDERAL PASS-THROUGH GRANT FUNDS FROM THE NYS DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$102,000 FOR THE 2014 HAZ MAT GRANT PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE SUFFOLK COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF FIRE, RESCUE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES AND TO EXECUTE GRANT RELATED AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has awarded Suffolk County Federal funds under the 2014 HazMat Grant Program to be implemented by the Suffolk County Department of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, the 2014 HazMat Grant Program will provide funds to the Department of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services to promote the development of regional partnerships among the State HazMat community; to build sustainable CBRNE Detection, Response, and Decontamination Capabilities; and to enhance the standing of the State's HazMat teams within FEMA's typing system; and

WHEREAS, this grant is for a twenty-four (24) month period from 9/1/2014 through 8/31/2016 in which the County will receive 100% grant funding in the amount of \$102,000 for the 2014 HazMat Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, said funds have not been included in the 2014 Operating Budget; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to accept \$102,000 and appropriate said grant funds as follows:
