**RESOLUTION NO. 29 -2015, TO REAPPOINT MEMBER OF COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION (MICHAEL KAUFMAN)**

**WHEREAS**, Section 14-2(A) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER provides for the appointment of fifteen (15) members of the Suffolk County Planning Commission, one member from each of the ten (10) towns in Suffolk County, one member from an incorporated village of under 5,000 population, one member from an incorporated village of over 5,000 population, and three members from the County at large; and

**WHEREAS**, the term of office for Suffolk County Planning Commission member from an incorporated village under 5,000 population, Michael Kaufman, expired on December 31, 2012 (Resolution No. 735-2012); and

**WHEREAS**, Steven Bellone, the County Executive of Suffolk has reappointed Michael Kaufman, currently residing in St. James, NY 11780, as the member from an incorporated village under 5,000 population of the Suffolk County Planning Commission now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that Michael Kaufman, currently residing in St, James, NY, 11780 is hereby reappointed as the member from an incorporated village under 5,000 of the Suffolk County Planning Commission for the term to expire December 31, 2016, pursuant to Section 14-2(A) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
