**RESOLUTION NO. 536 -2015, AUTHORIZING THE REAPPROPRIATION OF SEWER GRANT FUNDS**

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 83-2015 authorized the release of monies previously transferred and appropriated to fund sewer grants and loans to the Town of Riverhead, Town of Babylon, Village of Patchogue, and Village of Northport by Resolution No. 866-2013, consistent with the provisions of Local Law No. 31-2014; and

**WHEREAS**, the funds awarded to the Town of Babylon by Resolution No. 866-2013 and Resolution No. 83-2015 for Phase I of a multi-phase sewer infrastructure project were not provided prior to completion of the work therein; and

**WHEREAS**, the Sewer Infrastructure Committee reviewed and approved an amended application to re-appropriate the same funds to the Town of Babylon from Phase I, which was previously approved, to Phase II; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the release of monies previously transferred and appropriated to fund a sewer grant to the Town of Babylon by Resolution No. 866-2013 and Resolution No. 83-2015 is hereby approved and authorized consistent with the provisions of Local Law No. 31-2014; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the County Executive is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to enter into agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney, necessary to effectuate and finalize the grants to the Town of Babylon in the amounts set forth in Resolution No. 866-2013; and be it further

**3<sup>rd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
