

RESOLUTION NO. 924 -2015, APPROPRIATING FUNDS IN CONNECTION WITH SITE IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE RESTORATION OF CANAAN LAKE (CP 8715)

WHEREAS, the removal of invasive species in Canaan Lake will contribute to the health and restoration of the lake; and

WHEREAS, site improvement funds are needed at this time; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funding for this purpose has been included in the 2015 Adopted Capital Budget; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature, by resolution of even date herewith, has authorized the issuance of \$500,000 in Suffolk County Serial Bonds; and

WHEREAS, prior to the commencement of construction, an environmental review will be completed by Suffolk County in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 471-1994, as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006 established the use of a priority ranking system, implemented in the Adopted 2015 Capital Budget, as the basis for funding capital projects such as this project; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that it is hereby determined that this project, with a priority ranking of thirty-seven (37) is eligible for approval in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 471-1994 as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the proceeds of \$500,000 in Suffolk County Serial Bonds be and they hereby are appropriated as follows:

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), Environmental Conservation Law Article 8, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action, pursuant to Section 617.5 (c) (18), (20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NYCRR and within the meaning of Section 8-019 (2) of the New York Environmental Conservation Law as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and Legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
