RESOLUTION NO. 147 -2016, AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO ENTER INTO AN INTERMUNICIPAL AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWN OF BABYLON FOR INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF PAVERS AND STREETScape IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN SUFFOLK COUNTY'S RIGHT-OF-WAY ALONG CR 2, STRAIGHT PATH FROM THE VICINITY OF MOUNT AVENUE TO THE VICINITY OF WASHINGTON AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Town of Babylon is desirous of progressing various streetscape and other improvements, including sidewalks and medians, within the County's right-of-way along CR 2, Straight Path; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Babylon agrees to assume all maintenance, repair, and replacement of the Work; and

WHEREAS, Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law provides broad authority for municipal corporations to cooperate with each other in the performance of their respective responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Babylon adopted Resolution No. 694 authorizing the Town to execute an Intermunicipal Agreement with the County of Suffolk, for the purpose of performing the Work and providing the Services as part of the Town of Babylon's ongoing downtown revitalization and streetscape enhancements program; now, therefore be it

1st **RESOLVED**, that the County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Executive, or his designee, to execute an agreement with the Town of Babylon for the Installation and Maintenance of Pavers and Streetscape Improvements within Suffolk County's Right-of-Way along CR 2, Straight Path from the vicinity of Mount Avenue to the vicinity of Washington Avenue in a form substantially in conformance with the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and be it further

2nd **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), Environmental Conservation Law Article 8, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action, pursuant to Section 617.5 (C) (20) and (27) of Title 6 of New York Code of Rules and Regulations ("NYCRR"), in that the resolution concerns routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment, and adoption of a local legislative decision in connection with the same; and the Legislature has no further responsibilities under SEQRA.
