

**RESOLUTION NO. 464 -2016, REQUIRING NOTIFICATION  
OF BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED BY SUFFOLK COUNTY  
COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 198-2016 clarified that the County of Suffolk will administer the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code in regard to the construction of County-owned buildings only; accordingly, the County will no longer be responsible for issuing building permits and certificates of occupancy for construction of Suffolk County Community College buildings; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Suffolk funds the Community College's capital program and should continue to receive information regarding construction projects at the Community College; and

**WHEREAS**, the Community College should provide copies of building permits and certificates of occupancy to the Suffolk County Department of Public Works and the Clerk of the Legislature to keep the County apprised of progress on its construction projects; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that Suffolk County Community College shall submit copies of all building permits and certificates of occupancy issued for College construction projects to the Suffolk County Department of Public Works and the Clerk of the Legislature; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, the Clerk of the Legislature shall disseminate these filings to the Chair of the Education and Human Services Committee of the County Legislature upon receipt of same; and be it further

**3rd RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
