**WHEREAS**, the 2013 Operating Budget, when adopted, did not include funding for the Sachem Public Library; and

**WHEREAS**, the Suffolk County Legislature wishes to provide support for the Sachem Public Library in 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of this Legislature to transfer a portion of designated funding from the Holbrook Chamber of Commerce to the Sachem Public Library; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 378-2013 allows the County to enter into a contract with a not-for-profit agency for an amount under \$5,000 if authorized by a two-thirds vote of this Legislature; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 4-31 (G) of the Suffolk County Charter now allows amendment of the County Operating Budget by County Legislators four times during the fiscal year as long as the amendment reduces, lowers, terminates or cancels appropriations; abolishes positions of employment; terminates contract agencies; terminates or reduces the size of County programs or departments, or makes transfers of appropriations that are offset by reductions in other programs; now, therefore be it

**WHEREAS**, the Suffolk County Police Department, Suffolk County Sheriff's Office and Probation Department are participants in the United States Marshals Service Regional Fugitive Task Force; and

**WHEREAS**, the United States Marshals Service has previously provided the use of their vehicles to participants on the Task Force; and

**WHEREAS**, the United States Marshals Service is no longer providing the County use of their vehicles; and

**WHEREAS**, the vehicles currently being used by County Regional Fugitive Task Force members must be returned to the United States Marshals Service; and

**WHEREAS**, the Regional Fugitive Task Force participants will be receiving Joint Law Enforcement Operations vehicles which need to be titled in the name of the County and fleeted and maintained by the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the vehicles will only be used for Regional Fugitive Task Force related activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the only costs to the County will be fuel costs and minimal maintenance; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the Suffolk County Police Department, Suffolk County Sheriff's Office and Suffolk County Probation Department are given authorization to accept the Joint Law Enforcement Operations vehicles from the United States Marshals Service and to increase their respective fleets of undercover vehicles by one for Regional Fugitive Task Force use only; and be it further

### FY13 JLEO Task Force Vehicle Purchases

The funding to provide vehicles to state and local Joint Law Enforcement Operations participants has been approved and allocated for FY13. The general process for ordering will be the same as in FY10 with some small but important changes.

- 1) Vehicles will not be delivered directly to the recipients. GSA has a network of dealers that receives cars for them and the delivery location will be the closest GSA-associated dealership to the address provided by the state and local agencies. After orders are placed, the POC at the state/local agency will receive the delivery information.
- 2) Agencies must provide a "responsible party" signature on the form to reflect that they have designated someone who will receive the vehicle at the dealership and work with their motor pool to make sure all of their internal requirements are met to incorporate the new vehicle. This can be a motor vehicle officer, the task force officer, or any other person who is authorized to assume this duty. **Titling, registration and insurance of the vehicles are the state and local agencies' responsibility.**
- 3) The vehicle choices available were required to mirror the options available for purchase in the USMS fleet. These are the **ONLY** vehicles that may be selected for this round of purchases. The Chevrolet Equinox and GM Terrain have earlier closing dates than the rest of the vehicles and orders for these models must be received **no later than May 15**. All other orders are due by **June 14**.
- 4) **As in the last round, the mailing information provided for the agency must be the exact name and address that the vehicle will be titled and registered under.** The order and certificate of origin will be under this name. Please check with motor vehicle officers to make sure the mailing/titling information is correct.

#### **Ordering Instructions:**

Select a vehicle from the list provided by the USMS.

Complete the vehicle order form with the selected option number, make/model, color choice, and engine block heater option.

Review the mailing/titling information with motor pool and have MVO/Responsible Party sign to verify that it is correct.

Check the form to make sure every field is complete. Incomplete orders will be rejected and will not be filled unless corrected by the order deadline.

Submit to the USMS Point of Contact for the district or RFTF.
