**RESOLUTION NO. -2014, ESTABLISHING AN IMPREST
FUND, 001-1190-4770, FOR THE SUFFOLK COUNTY DISTRICT
ATTORNEY, INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY GRANT, SPECIAL
SERVICES ACCOUNT**

WHEREAS, the County Law of New York, Section 705, authorizes the establishment of a prosecution fund for the payment, in advance of audit, of expenditures necessarily incurred by the District Attorney in the prosecution of criminal actions and proceedings. In accordance with this authority, on June 10, 1968, the Suffolk County Board of Supervisors (now the County Legislature) enacted Resolution No. 408, which authorized the County Comptroller to transfer funds within the Suffolk County District Attorney's Budget to establish the prosecution fund (now the Special Services Account); and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 892-2013 accepted grant funds from the United State Department of Justice in the sum of \$59,788 into 001-1190-4770 (Special Services Account), and

WHEREAS, \$25,000 of the \$59,788 are to be used specifically for confidential investigations as "buy money" for the purchase of trademark counterfeit merchandise; now, therefore be it

1st **RESOLVED**, that an Imprest Fund, in Fund 001, Appropriation 1190, and Sub Object 4770 shall be established to a funding limit of \$25,000. The reimbursement of this fund will take place in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Suffolk County Department of Audit and Control and the Suffolk County Treasurer; and be it further

2nd **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the lead agency under SEQRA and Chapter 279 of the Suffolk County Code, hereby determines that this resolution constitutes Type II action.



At the direction of the District Attorney and in accordance with the County Executive All Department Heads Memorandum 2-14, I have attached a request for a Suffolk County Resolution.





TITLE OF BILL: A Resolution establishing an IMPREST Account for use by the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office to conduct undercover operations targeting trademark counterfeit crime.

RESOLUTION NO. - 2014, ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. - 2014, A LOCAL LAW TO LIFT SALARY CAP FOR CHIEF DEPUTY MEDICAL EXAMINER

WHEREAS, there was duly presented and introduced to this County Legislature at a regular meeting held on , 2014, a proposed local law entitled, "**A LOCAL LAW TO LIFT SALARY CAP FOR CHIEF DEPUTY MEDICAL EXAMINER;**" and said local law in final form is the same as when presented and introduced; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that said local law be enacted in form as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. - 2014, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK

A LOCAL LAW TO LIFT SALARY CAP FOR CHIEF DEPUTY MEDICAL EXAMINER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

This Legislature finds and determines that the County of Suffolk enacted Local Law No. 23-1996 to ensure, in part, that no County employee's annual salary would equal or exceed the salary of the County Executive.

This Legislature finds and determines that recruitment of a qualified person in the highly skilled position of the Chief Deputy Medical Examiner results in stringent competition among institutions for the most qualified candidates for this position.

This Legislature further determines that in order to obtain the services of the most qualified candidates to serve as Chief Deputy Medical Examiner, the County must be able to compete with other institutions that offer highly competitive salaries.

This Legislature further finds that, pursuant to the Suffolk County Code, during the Chief Medical Examiner's absence or inability to act, the Chief Deputy Medical Examiner must possess the same powers and perform the same duties of the Chief Medical Examiner, and as such, both individuals must be highly qualified to perform the same functions.

This Legislature further finds that the County requires the services of a Chief Deputy Medical Examiner with the highest qualifications and it has been a problem to recruit a qualified individual for this position due, in part, to the restrictions imposed by Local Law No. 23-1996 which dictate that no County employee's annual salary can equal or exceed the salary of the County Executive.

Therefore, the purpose of this law is to exempt the position of the Chief Deputy Medical Examiner from the existing restrictions on income for exempt management employees.

Section 2. Amendment.

Chapter 205-6 of the Administrative Local Laws of Suffolk County is hereby amended as follows:

Article II. Salary Cap

* * *

§205-6. Exemption.

This article shall not apply to the following positions:

- (a) President of Suffolk County Community College;
- (b) Commissioner of Health Services; [and]
- (c) Chief Medical Examiner; and
- (d) Chief Deputy Medical Examiner.

Section 3. Applicability

This law shall apply to all actions on or after the effective date of this law.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not effect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. SEQRA Determination.

This Legislature, being the State Environment Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20) and/or (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.

This proposed local law would amend Chapter 205 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE to exempt the position of Chief Deputy Medical Examiner from the existing salary cap for exempt management employees and elected officials.

Presently, exempt management employees and elected officials are barred from receiving an annual salary higher than that of the County Executive. The President of the Community College, the Commissioner of Health Services and the Chief Medical Examiner are not subject to this cap.

This law would take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of the State.


