**WHEREAS**, women make up approximately 52% of the Suffolk County population, thereby making women the largest demographic group within the County of Suffolk; and

**WHEREAS**, women's advocacy groups and women's organizations, in conjunction with the Suffolk County Division of Women's Services fight every day in the front lines of our society to protect the health and safety of women; and

**WHEREAS**, women's advocacy groups and women's organizations, along and in conjunction with the Suffolk County Division of Women's Services, promote the economic interests of women in the everyday workplace; and

**WHEREAS**, women who work full time earn, on average 77 cents for each dollar earned by a male performing comparable work under comparable conditions including comparable background, expertise, and experience; and

**WHEREAS**, the figures are even worse for women of color as African-American women earn only 64 cents and Latinas 55 cents for each dollar earned by a white male; and

**WHEREAS**, women participate in the work force in greater numbers and percentages than ever before, in many instances becoming the sole income earner in their families due to skill or the difficult economic circumstances in which we currently live; and

**WHEREAS**, the single most important thing we can do to ensure the economic, health, safety and security of women is to secure Pay Equity for Women in the Workplace; now therefore, be it



**Subject:** REQUEST FOR LEGISLATIVE RESOLUTION

The County of Suffolk contracts with Southampton Alternatives for the provision of Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Services to County residents. The 2014 funding for Southampton Alternatives net contract is 85% Federal funds passed through New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services and only 15% County which is included in the County Adopted Budget.

Southampton Alternatives 2014 funds have been restricted due to Administrative Expenses being greater than 20% of the total agency program expenses. Restricting 2014 funds would not allow Southampton Alternatives to meet operating costs for the continued provision of Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Services to County residents.

The Division respectfully requests a Certificate of Necessity in order to insure the continuation of the above mentioned services. Attached please find a draft intro resolution, fiscal impact statement, resolution routing form, NYSOASAS State Aid Funding Authorization dated March 5, 2014 and Southampton Alternatives program description.

TITLE OF BILL: Approving county funding for Southampton Alternatives for the provision of substance abuse services.

PURPOSE OR GENERAL IDEA OF BILL: This legislation is needed to approve administrative expenses greater than 20% of Southampton Alternatives total agency program expenses. This contract agency is 85% federally funded and 15% County funded and they provide Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment services to County residents.

SUMMARY OF SPECIAL PROVISIONS: Section 189-41 of the Suffolk County Code requires a two-thirds vote of the legislature to approve administrative expenses great than 20% being claimed by a contracted agency.

JUSTIFICATION: Approval of this resolution will allow 2014 payments to Southampton Alternatives be released by Audit & Control so they may continue to provide substance abuse prevention and treatment services to Suffolk County residents.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: None, funds have already been included in the 2014 Adopted Operating Budget.
