**WHEREAS**, this position does not currently exist in the 2015 Suffolk County Operating Budget; and

**WHEREAS**, \$57,120 of the total one year expenses for said position are included in the GIVE II grant funds, accepted and appropriated by separate resolution; now therefore be it,


**PURPOSE OR GENERAL IDEA OF BILL: Pursuant to a grant award by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, the District Attorney's Office seeks the creation of a research technician position to assist the county partnership in the analysis of investigative data in prosecution gun related crimes.**

**SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS: This legislation will increase by one the number of personal in the District Attorney's Office. The grant funds will be utilized to hire a research technician who will be assigned to the Special Investigations Bureau. The reach technician will be tasked with working with detectives assigned to the Gun Suppression team and with the other county partners to analyze data in connection with strategies to reduce gun related violence.**

**JUSTIFICATION: The new position is funded by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice and is vital to the partnership strategy submitted and approved by DCJS to reduce gun related violence. The research technician will work and interface wit he SCPD and other agencies in sharing real time investigative data.**

A CN is being requested because the requested position is part of the County G.I.V.E. strategy. A separate resolution is being submitted pursuant to Local Law 40 and simultaneously with this introductory resolution. That resolution seeks to accept the remaining G.I.V.E. funding for the County Partners, including the District Attorney's Office. A Certificate of Necessity is also being requested for this resolution as this is a one year grant award beginning July 1, 2015 and any unexpended funds will be lost at the end of the grant year.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS: The requested position salary is fully paid for by grant funds. The fringe is partially funded pursuant to the rules established by DCJS which limited funding to forty percent of the total cost.

**WHEREAS**, there was duly presented and introduced to this County Legislature at a regular meeting held on 2015, a proposed local law entitled, "**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 563 OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE TO MODIFY THE LAWS RELATING TO SEPTIC INDUSTRY BUSINESSES;**" and said local law in final form is the same as when presented and introduced; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that said local law be enacted in form as follows:

**LOCAL LAW NO. -2015, SUFFOLK COUNTY,  
NEW YORK**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 563 OF THE  
SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE TO MODIFY THE LAWS  
RELATING TO SEPTIC INDUSTRY BUSINESSES**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF  
SUFFOLK**, as follows:

**Section 1. Legislative Intent.**

This Legislature finds and determines that the provisions of Article VII of Chapter 563 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE were enacted to provide the County of Suffolk with the means necessary to regulate septic industry businesses and require such businesses to be licensed to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the consumers of Suffolk County.

This Legislature further finds that in 2014, it approved the use of funds from Fund 477 Water Quality Protection for the Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment Program.

This Legislature finds that in furtherance of the Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment demonstration program, participating manufacturers are donating their treatment systems to the program with installation, and will be maintaining those systems under a five year warranty during this demonstration program. The value of the donated innovative alternative system, installation, and warranty is estimated at \$20,000 per system.

This Legislature also finds and determines that these participating manufacturers should be exempt from the fees associated with obtaining a license under Chapter 563 as the purpose of this demonstration program is to test these systems and to gather the data necessary for the County Department of Health Services to determine if these treatment systems should be approved for general public use to improve water quality within our County.

Therefore, the purpose of this law is to amend Article VII of Chapter 563 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE to exempt participating manufacturers from paying the application and license fees for the purpose of allowing these participating manufacturers to donate and provide the maintenance for their Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment systems as required under the County's demonstration program.

**Section 2. Amendments.**

Article VII of Chapter 563 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE is hereby amended as follows:

**Chapter 563**

**LICENSED OCCUPATIONS**

\*\*\*\*

**Article VII**

**Septic Industry Businesses**

\*\*\*\*

**§563-79. Application procedure; qualifications; issuance of license[.]; exemptions from application fees.**

**I. Application procedure; qualifications; issuance of license.**

A. All applications for licenses shall be submitted in writing, on forms furnished by the [Office] Department of Labor, Licensing and Consumer Affairs [,]. Such applications [and] shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee of \$200 from all applicants, other than those exempt under the provisions of this §563-79.

**II. Exemptions from Application Fees.**

Exemptions shall be as follows:

A. Persons who have been accepted into the Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment demonstration program sponsored by the County to demonstrate their Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment systems to the Suffolk County Department of Health Services for approval for general public use, who are donating their systems into the program and who are maintaining those systems at the specific sites accepted into the program are exempt from paying the application fees under this section. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any persons who are exempt from paying application fees under this section, shall be responsible for applying for and obtaining the appropriate license under this article. In addition, such persons shall be responsible for applying for and obtaining the appropriate license under this article and paying the associated application fees for said license in the event they contract to

do any other work at the specific sites accepted into the program that is not associated with the donated systems or in the event they contract to do any work at any other site or sites that are not accepted into the program.

\*\*\*\*

**§563-80. Term of licenses; renewal; conditions[.]; exemptions from license fees.**

**I. Term of licenses; renewal; conditions.**

A. All licenses, except temporary licenses, shall be for periods of two years from the date of issuance thereof, at the discretion of the Department, and shall expire on the last day of the 24<sup>th</sup> month of such issuance. Subsequent renewals shall be for periods of two years.

B. The fee for a commercial, industrial, residential septic tank/sewer drain treatment, bacteria additives and maintenance license shall be \$200 per annum, other than for those persons exempt under the provisions of this §563-80.

**II. Exemptions from License Fees.**

Exemptions shall be as follows:

A. Persons who have been accepted into the Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment demonstration program sponsored by the County to demonstrate their Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment systems to the Suffolk County Department of Health Services for approval for general public use, who are donating their systems into the program and who are maintaining those systems at the specific sites accepted into the program are exempt from paying the license fees under this section for the duration of the program only, which shall be no longer than five (5) consecutive years. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any persons who are exempt from paying license fees under this section, shall be responsible for applying for and obtaining the appropriate license under this article. In addition, such persons shall be responsible for applying for and obtaining the appropriate license under this article and paying the associated license fees for said license in the event they contract to do any other work at the specific sites accepted into the program that is not associated with the donated systems, in the event they continue to provide maintenance or other associated work for the donated systems after the program expires, or in the event they contract to do any work at any other site or sites that are not accepted into the program.

\*\*\*\*

**Section 3. Applicability.**

This law shall apply to all applications for licenses filed pursuant to this article on or after the effective date of the law.

**Section 4. Severability.**

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

**Section 5. SEQRA Determination.**

This Legislature, being the State Environment Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20) and/or (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of nonapplicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.

**Section 6. Effective Date.**

This law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.



In furtherance of the Innovative Alternative Onsite Wastewater Treatment demonstration program, a number of manufacturers of wastewater treatment systems are donating their treatment systems and providing maintenance for the systems for the duration of the demonstration project. This local law would exempt these manufacturers from paying application and licensing fees that are applicable to septic industry businesses in Suffolk County. These manufacturers would remain subject to all other licensing requirements set forth in Chapter 563, Article VII of the Suffolk County Code.
