WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 152-2012 the Department of Public Works is authorized to illuminate the H. Lee Dennison Building during the month of October with a pink glow during the month of October as part of the Breast Cancer Awareness Program; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 152-2012 further provided that the Department of Public Works could change the lighting at the H. Lee Dennison Building during October if different lighting is specifically authorized by separate resolution; and

WHEREAS, mental health issues affect as many as one in four Americans; and

WHEREAS, the stigma associated with mental illness, often lead to many people being too ashamed or embarrassed to seek the help they need for themselves or their loved ones; and

WHEREAS, through education and outreach we must work together to break through the stigma associated with mental illness and express compassion for those who struggle with mental health issues to seek to change their lives for the better; and

WHEREAS, it is also important to highlight the importance of mental health to overall health; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County wishes to participate in an illumination project help raise awareness of mental health issues; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed, pursuant to Section 8-2(W) of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CHARTER to illuminate the north side of the H. Lee Dennison Executive Office Building facing Veterans Memorial Highway with a green glow on October 13th, beginning in 2016 and continuing every year thereafter; and be it further

RESOLUTION NO. -2016 AUTHORIZING SUFFOLK COUNTY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH SUFFOLK COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY (SCWA) AND AMENDING THE 2016 OPERATING BUDGET AND TRANSFERRING FUNDS TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR PAYMENT OF SERVICES TO PROVIDE A SAFE SUPPLY OF DRINKING WATER TO RESIDENTS IN THE VICINITY OF THE SUFFOLK COUNTY FIRE ACADEMY IN YAPHANK

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) has identified two chemicals known as PFOS (perfluorooctane sulfonate) and PFOA (perfluorooctanoic acid) as emerging contaminants; and

WHEREAS, these chemicals are part of a class of chemicals known as perfluorinated compounds (PFCs), which are currently unregulated by the federal government, but have been used in a number of industrial and commercial products such as firefighting foam, as well as coatings that repel water, oil, stains and grease; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2016, New York State added PFOS and PFOA to the state's list of hazardous substances; and

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk is the owner of the Suffolk County Fire Academy property located at 676 Pine St., Yaphank, NY 11980 (also known as the Firematics Training Center); and

WHEREAS, a firefighting agent known as Aqueous Film Forming Foam (AFFF) may contain PFOS and PFOA, and AFFF was used in the past for fire training purposes at the Suffolk County Fire Academy; and

WHEREAS, the County has identified certain properties with private wells that have become contaminated or may become contaminated with PFOS and PFOA in concentrations greater than recommended by drinking water guidelines as indicated on the agreement attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Water Authority (SCWA) has indicated it has the authority pursuant to law to execute an agreement with the County pursuant to Public Auth. Law § 1078-d to connect the identified properties currently served with a private well to the public water supply; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure a safe supply of drinking water, the County desires to have the SCWA provide connection to the public water supply for such properties as described in said agreement with the Suffolk County Water Authority (SCWA) pursuant to Public Auth. Law § 1078-d to connect the identified properties currently served with a private well to the public water supply; now, therefore, be it

1st RESOLVED, that the 2016 County Operating Budget is hereby amended and the County Comptroller be and hereby is authorized to transfer the following funds and authorizations:

2nd RESOLVED, that the moneys appropriated pursuant to this resolution shall be used for the sole and exclusive purpose of funding Suffolk County Water Authority (SCWA) to connect the identified properties currently served with a private well to the public water supply to provide a safe supply of drinking water to residents as set forth in this Resolution; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that the County Executive be and hereby is authorized to execute an agreement in substantial conformance with the agreement annexed hereto between Suffolk County and the SCWA to connect the identified properties currently served with a private well to the public water supply; and

4th RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) Lead Agency, hereby finds and determines that the adoption of this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Title 6 NYCRR Section 617.5(c) (20) and (27) since it constitutes a local legislative decision in connection with routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment. As a Type II action, the Legislature has no further responsibilities under SEQRA.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this ____ day of _____, 2016, by and between the County of Suffolk, a municipal corporation, having its principal office and place of business at H. Lee Dennison Building, 100 Veterans Memorial Highway, Hauppauge, NY 11788 (hereinafter also referred to as "County"), and the Suffolk County Water Authority, a public benefit corporation, having its principal office and place of business at 4060 Sunrise Highway, Oakdale, New York 11769 (hereinafter also referred to a "SCWA").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has identified certain properties with private wells that have become contaminated or may become contaminated with pollutants in concentrations greater than recommended by drinking water guidelines as indicated on the Map attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Authorities Law § 1078-d, the County desires to have the SCWA provide hookups to public water supply for such properties by extending its water mains, in addition to installing meters, curb stops and meter vaults and by engaging a contractor to install private services and retire private wells (the "Services") as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, the parties represent that they have the power and authority pursuant to law to bind themselves to the provisions hereof;

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. The SCWA shall install a water main along Yaphank Avenue, Yaphank to serve the identified properties on Schedule 1 in the vicinity of Yaphank Avenue which do not have access to a water main. The SCWA will provide a curb stop, meter, meter vault and a service line from the water main to the edge of the property line for each identified property. For the installation of the water main, curb stop, meter, meter vault and service line from the water main to the edge of the property line, the SCWA will charge a water main surcharge and tap fee for each of the identified properties as indicated on Schedule 1. attached hereto and made a part hereof. The water main, curb stop, meter, meter vault and service line from the water main to the edge of the property line shall be and remain the property of the SCWA.

2. For each of the identified properties for which the SCWA provides access to public water in accordance with paragraph 1, the County shall pay to the SCWA the tap fee and main surcharge as set forth on the Schedule 1. The SCWA shall deliver a Voucher, as more fully described in paragraph 12 of this Agreement, to the County for amounts due and payable upon completion of the work for each identified property. The County shall pay such amounts to the SCWA within 30 days after approval of the Voucher by the Suffolk County Comptroller.

3. The SCWA will engage the services of a contractor in accordance with terms and conditions of "SCWA Contract No. 7388 - Installation of Water Service Lines - Yaphank" (hereinafter "Contract No. 7388") that was let in accordance the requirements of Public Authorities Law Section 1088, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The

SCWA will cause the contractor to install service lines from the meter vault to the internal plumbing of each of the identified properties, install and connect adapters and fittings, install NSF certified lead free brass ball shutoff valves, hang and properly support Type L or better copper tubing, disconnect and cap existing wells/pumps and reconnect electrical grounds in accordance with the National Electrical Code, all in accordance with the terms and conditions of Contract No. 7388 for each of the identified properties. The service line from the meter vault to the internal plumbing, adapters and fittings, NSF certified lead free brass ball shutoff valves, copper tubing, and all other items installed in accordance with Contract No. 7388 shall be and remain the property of the respective owners of each of the identified properties.

4. For each of the identified properties for which the SCWA causes the Services to be performed in accordance with paragraph 3, the County shall pay to the SCWA all amounts in accordance with the terms, conditions and amounts set forth in this Agreement. The maximum amount to be paid by the County for each identified property is indicated on Schedule 1. The SCWA shall deliver the Voucher to the County for amounts due and payable upon completion of the work for each identified property. The County shall pay such to the SCWA within 30 days after approval of the Voucher by the County Comptroller.

5. The identified properties for which the SCWA shall install water mains and provide public water service in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall include the following properties identified on the Map and the Schedule 1 attached hereto: Lot #1, Lot #2, Lot #3, Lot #4, Lot #5, Lot #6, Lot #7, Lot #8, Lot #9, Lot #11, Lot #12, Lot #13, Lot #14, Lot #15 Lot #16, Lot #20, Lot #21 and Lot #22.

6. After the identified properties have been connected to public water in accordance with the above provisions, the SCWA shall provide water service to the connected properties in accordance with its established rates, charges, rules and regulations as the same may change from time to time. Connected properties shall be responsible for all water use service charges and taxes.

7. (a) SCWA shall obtain any necessary permissions or approvals in writing from the property owner of each property prior to performance of the Services described herein on the property.

(b) If the property owner denies permission to perform the Services on a specific property, the SCWA shall perform installation of the meter vault and service line to the property edge and the County shall pay the surcharge and tapping fee for the property in accordance with paragraph 1, above

8. SCWA shall obtain any necessary governmental approvals or permits required by law for the Services to be performed.

9. Each party hereto shall defend, indemnify and save harmless, to the extent permitted by law, the other party, its respective officers, agents, servants, employees, contractors and representatives against and from all suits, losses, demands, payments, actions, recoveries, judgments and costs of every kind and description and from all damages to which the other party

or any of its officers, agents, servants, employees and representatives may be subjected by reason of injury to person or property of others resulting from the implementation of this Agreement by the other party. The aforesaid indemnification shall not be applicable to any liability caused by the acts, omissions, faults or negligence of the party seeking indemnification.

10. Each party shall maintain insurance in amounts and types appropriate to the Services provided hereunder and shall provide proof of coverage to the other.

11. The Term of this Agreement shall be from 2016 to

12. (a) Presentation of Suffolk County Payment Voucher. In order for payment to be made by the County to the SCWA for the Services, the SCWA shall prepare and present a Suffolk County Payment Voucher (Voucher), which shall be documented by sufficient, competent and evidential matter. Each Suffolk County Payment Voucher submitted for payment is subject to Audit at any time during the Term or any extension thereof. This audit provision shall survive expiration or termination of this Contract for a period of not less than seven (7) years.

(b) Voucher Documentation. The Suffolk County Payment Voucher shall list all information regarding the Services and other items for which expenditures have been or will be made in accordance with the Contract. Either upon execution of the Agreement (for the Services already rendered and expenditures already made), or not more than thirty (30) days after the expenditures were made, and in no event after the 31st day of January following the end of each year of the Contract, the SCWA shall furnish the County with detailed documentation in support of the payment for the Services or expenditures under the Contract, e.g., dates of the Service, worksite locations, activities, hours worked, and pay rates for all Services. The Suffolk County Payment Voucher shall include time records, certified by the SCWA as true and accurate, of all personnel for whom expenditures are claimed during the period. All Suffolk County Payment Vouchers must bear a signature as that term is defined pursuant to New York State General Construction Law §46 by duly authorized persons. Disbursements made by the SCWA in accordance with the Contract and submitted for reimbursement must be documented and must comply with accounting procedures as set forth by the Suffolk County Department of Audit and Control.

(c) Payment by the County shall be made within thirty (30) days after approval of the Voucher by the Comptroller.

(d) Final Voucher. The acceptance by the SCWA of payment of all billings made on an approved voucher shall operate as and shall be a release of the County from all claims by the SCWA through the date of the Voucher.

13. Subject to Appropriation of Funds. The Contract is subject to the amount of funds appropriated each fiscal year and any subsequent modifications thereof by the County Legislature, and no liability shall be incurred by the County beyond the amount of funds appropriated each fiscal year by the County Legislature for the Services.

14. (a) The SCWA shall maintain accounts, books, records, documents, other evidence, and accounting procedures and practices which sufficiently and properly reflect all direct and

indirect costs of any nature expended in the performance of the Contract, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and with rules, regulations and financial directives, as may be promulgated by the Suffolk County Department of Audit and Control and the Department. The SCWA shall permit inspection and audit of such accounts, books, records, documents and other evidence by the Department and the Suffolk County Comptroller, or their representatives, as often as, in their judgment, such inspection is deemed necessary. Such right of inspection and audit as set forth in subparagraph (b) below shall exist during the Term and for a period of seven (7) years after expiration or termination of the Contract.

(b) The SCWA shall retain all accounts, books, records, and other documents relevant to the Contract for seven (7) years after final payment is made by the County. Federal, State, and/or County auditors and any persons duly authorized by the County shall have full access and the right to examine any of said materials during said period. Such access is granted notwithstanding any exemption from disclosure that may be claimed for those records which are subject to nondisclosure agreements, trade secrets and commercial information or financial information that is privileged or confidential.

15. (a) All payments made under the Contract are subject to audit by the Comptroller pursuant to Article V of the Suffolk County Charter. The SCWA further agrees that the Comptroller and the Department shall have access to and the right to examine, audit, excerpt, copy or transcribe any pertinent transactions or other records relating to Services under the Contract. If such an audit discloses overpayments by the County to the SCWA, within thirty (30) days after the issuance of an official audit report by the Comptroller or his duly designated representatives, the SCWA shall repay the amount of such overpayment by check to the order of the Suffolk County Treasurer or shall submit a proposed plan of repayment to the Comptroller. If there is no response, or if satisfactory repayments are not made, the County may recoup overpayments from any amounts due or becoming due to the SCWA from the County under the Contract or any other Fund Source.

(b) The provisions of this paragraph shall survive the expiration or termination of the Contract for a period of seven (7) years.

(c) The SCWA shall comply with the "Comptroller's Rules and Regulations for Consultant's Agreements" as promulgated by the Department of Audit and Control of Suffolk County and any amendments thereto during the Term of the Contract. The "Comptroller's Rules and Regulations for Consultant's Agreements" may be viewed online at the County's website, SuffolkCountyny.gov; go to "Government," then "Comptroller," then "Consultant's Agreements."

17. (a). The Total Cost of the Contract to the County shall not exceed \$.

(b) The Budget is set forth in Schedule 1. Schedule 1 includes the maximum amount to be paid by the County for each component of the Services.

(c). The SCWA shall be entitled to no more compensation and/or reimbursement than is provided in this Contract for the completion of all work, labor, and services contemplated in

this Contract, and in full reimbursement of all travel, equipment, supplies and other expenses of every nature and kind whatsoever, notwithstanding the total amount of time expended or expenses actually incurred.

18. If, for any reason whatsoever, the County's payments to the SCWA for Services provided during the Term under the Contract are for amounts more than the amounts specified in the Budget for the Services actually rendered, the total cost of the Contract shall be reduced to the net amount of fees and charges for the SCWA's Services which have actually been provided. The total amount to be paid by the County shall not exceed the lesser of (i) the fees and charges for Services actually provided by the SCWA or (ii) the Total Cost of the Contract as set forth in this Section ____.

19. The SCWA shall repair any damage to a private property owner's lawn or property, caused directly or indirectly by the SCWA, at no cost to the property owner or the County. The SCWA shall require the contractor to repair any damage to a private property owner's lawn or property, caused directly or indirectly by the contractor, at no cost to the property owner or the County.



