RESOLUTION NO. -2015, DIRECTING THE SUFFOLK COUNTY TRAFFIC AND PARKING VIOLATIONS AGENCY TO INSTITUTE A PAYMENT PLAN PROGRAM FOR PARKING TICKETS

WHEREAS, Local Law 9-2013 established the Traffic and Parking Violations Agency ("TPVA") in Suffolk County to administer and dispose of traffic and parking violations in a more efficient manner; and

WHEREAS, despite improvements in the local economy, many lower and middle income residents continue to face challenges in making ends meet; and

WHEREAS, the fines, fees and surcharges resulting from traffic and parking tickets are often quite substantial and some residents cannot afford to give the full amount of those charges in one payment ; and

WHEREAS, unpaid fines, fees and surcharges associated with traffic tickets are often not collected or prove costly to collect and can result in lost revenue for Suffolk County's government and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, in order to alleviate undue financial burden and to encourage the full payment of fines, fees and surcharges attached to parking tickets, the TPVA should develop a payment plan that allows payment of fines, fees and surcharges over time and in installments; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the Director of the TPVA is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to establish a payment program that will allow for the payment of fines, fees and surcharges for parking violations to be made as a series of smaller payments over a period of up to one year; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that the Director of the TPVA will submit the proposed payment program to the County Executive and the County Legislature within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this resolution and the Director shall implement this program within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.

COVERING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT FOR EMPLOYEES COVERED UNDER THE BARGAINING UNIT NO. 10 FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2011 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2018

WHEREAS, the County and the President of the Suffolk County Correction Officers Association have reached an agreement covering the terms and conditions of employment for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2018, subject to the approval, to the extent necessary, by the Suffolk County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, such agreement has been set down in a stipulation of agreement, a copy of which has been filed with the Clerk of the Suffolk County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, such agreement has been ratified by the Suffolk County Correction Officers Association; now therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Executive be and is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the Suffolk County Correction Officers Association in accordance with the Stipulation of Agreement dated June 5, 2015, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Suffolk County Legislature, covering the terms and conditions of employment of the Suffolk County Correction Officers Association Bargaining Unit No. 10 for the period January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2018; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) AND WITHIN THE MEANING OF Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management, and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.

STIPULATION OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK AND
SUFFOLK COUNTY CORRECTION OFFICERS ASSOCIATION

All provisions of the County/COA January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2007 Collective Bargaining Agreement, as amended by an interest arbitration award covering the period January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2010, will remain unchanged except as specifically modified herein.

1. **Term:** Eight years - 1/1/2011 through 12/31/2018.
2. **Percentage Raises:** (Section 5)

For all employees hired on or before the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, including those who separated from service with the County on or after January 1, 2014:

0%	1/1 - \$625 (eff. 1/1/14) 6/1 - 0.5% (eff. 1/1/14)	4/1 - \$875 6/1 - 0.5% 12/1 - 0.5%	4/1 - \$900 6/1 - 1% 12/1 - 1.5%	6/1/16 – 3.25% 6/1/17 – 3.25% 6/1/18 – 3.25%

All raises set forth above will become effective on the dates set forth above, except that the raises effective in 2014 and 2015 will not be included in employees' paychecks until the first pay period in 2016. Retroactive payments for the raises effective in 2014 and 2015, other than for retroactive overtime payments and compensatory time payouts, will be paid upon the employee's separation from employment at the employee's then prevailing hourly rate, except that these deferred monies may be paid in 2020 at the sole discretion of the County upon the request of a then current employee.

3. **Healthcare:** The parties agree to continue the existing EMHP agreement with the amendments made in the 2012 EMHP extension agreement through 12/31/2020.

4. Wages. The salary schedule for any unit member hired after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement is attached as Exhibit "A." The starting salary will be \$30,000 and will be frozen for the duration of the 2011-2018 Agreement. The salary schedule consists of 12 years to top step, inclusive of the starting step, with raises every six months. Current employees will maintain the current pay scales, with steps being increased each time top step is increased, consistent with preexisting contract language. The index for all promotional titles and assignments to Investigator titles for employees hired after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement are to be based on the top step CO I salary for employees hired after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement.

5. Productivity: Section 5.1: Employees' duties and responsibilities will be expanded to include responsibility for homeland security, anti-terrorism and disaster response. Effective January 1, 2015, for employees hired before the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, top base pay will be increased by \$700. The \$700 increase will not be included in employees' paychecks until the first pay period in 2016. All retroactive payments for 2015, other than for retroactive overtime payments and compensatory time payouts, will be paid upon the employee's separation from employment at the employee's then prevailing hourly rate, except that these deferred monies may be paid in 2020 at the sole discretion of the County upon the request of a then current employee.

6. Management Rights:

a. Section 20(C)(2): Effective upon the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, travel time and mileage, if applicable, will be waived should the Sheriff's Office conduct firearms training at F6 labs in Nassau County.

b. The COA hereby withdraws all pending grievances and improper practice charges, including appeals, against the County.

7. Longevity (Section 5.2):

Effective January 1, 2016, longevity pay will be increased by \$125. In addition, a new year 30 will be added at \$3,500, inclusive of the \$125 increase.

Effective January 1, 2018, longevity pay will be increased by \$200 years 15, 20, 25 and 30.

8. Rights & Benefits: Effective upon the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, all contractual provisions for spouses will be extended to domestic partners if certified or qualified pursuant to the requirements for healthcare pursuant to the EMHP agreement (effective 1/1/2012) or any other NYS or federal healthcare plan. A domestic partner receiving surviving spouse benefits must annually certify that s/he is not in a domestic partnership or married.

9. Education: Effective January 1, 2014, for all employees hired before the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, top base pay will be increased by \$700 and the salary scale will be accordingly adjusted. The \$700 will not be included in employees' paychecks until the first pay period in 2016. All retroactive payments for 2014 and 2015, other than for retroactive overtime payments and compensatory time payouts, will be paid upon the employee's separation from employment at the employee's then prevailing hourly rate, except that these deferred monies may be paid in 2020 at the sole discretion of the County upon the request of a then current employee. All employees hired on or after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement will be required to complete a minimum of 120 college credits or obtain a Bachelor's degree. Employees who have not satisfied the 120 college credit or degree requirement by November 1 of any year after reaching top step pay will have their final holiday check for that year reduced by the appropriate amount set forth above until the requirements are satisfied. Current employees will be given credit for time served in the Sheriff's Office and training received to date to satisfy their college credit or degree obligation pursuant to this provision.

10. Deferrals: All deferrals are intended to be pension neutral. Nothing set forth in this 2011-2018 Agreement regarding deferrals will in any way diminish pension benefits or the County's pension contributions.

11. Layoffs: No employee will be subject to layoff for reasons including, but not limited to, budgetary, policy, legislative, executive, pension cost, healthcare cost, inflation, revenue, staffing needs, contracts, privatization; etc. It is the intent of the parties to list all possible bases for layoff of employees in accordance with NYS statutory and case law and decisions.

12. Disability Payments: Any employee hired after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement who becomes disabled as a result of a line of duty injury and who receive a disability pension from NYS prior to reaching top step salary, will receive a supplemental payment from the County equal to the difference between the pension granted and 33.33%, 50% or 75%, as applicable, of top step at the time the pension was granted. This supplemental payment will continue in full force as long as the employee or surviving spouse, or beneficiary, receives a pension benefit from NYS.

13. 401(a): Within six months of the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, the County will make every effort to establish a 401(a) program for severance deferral. The program will have no cost to the County. If the parties cannot agree, then the issue will proceed directly to arbitration pursuant to the contractual grievance procedure.

14. Catastrophic Illness (Section 8.9): Effective upon the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, donations will be made and used at the rate of 1:1 rather than 1:2.

15. Workers' Compensation (Section 7.4, Appendix B(¶ 12): Effective upon the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, for all employees not then currently receiving workers' compensation benefits, 12 weeks will be changed to 26 weeks.

16. Administrative Pool Time (Section 8.5(C)): Effective upon the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, the Pool will be increased by 100 days (prorated for 2015).

17. Partial Lump Sum Option: The County will, by not later than 90 days from the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement, elect the Partial Lump Sum distribution of retirement benefit option set forth in Chapter 135 of the Laws of 2014.

18. Wage Protection: Employees hired on or after the complete ratification and approval of the 2011-2018 Agreement will have their top step remain at the top step on December 31, 2013 (\$78,690) and all other steps will remain frozen in accordance with Paragraph 4 herein during the term of the 2011-2018 Agreement, absent a successor agreement or award, notwithstanding any other provision contained herein to the contrary, except as provided in Paragraph 9.

19. Reopener: The Association will be entitled to re-open negotiations over terms and conditions of employment in the event that the DSPBA agrees to a collective bargaining agreement or is awarded through interest arbitration a change in overall terms and conditions of employment for the period 2011-2018 inconsistent with the pattern set forth in this 2011-2018 Agreement.

THIS AGREEMENT REFLECTS THE COMPLETE AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES AND WILL NOT BE AMENDED EXCEPT BY WRITTEN INSTRUMENT SIGNED AND RATIFIED BY ALL PARTIES. THIS AGREEMENT REPLACES, SUPERSEDES AND VOIDS ANY PRIOR AGREEMENTS AMONG THE PARTIES TO THE CONTRARY.

SHOULD ANY PROVISION IN THIS AGREEMENT BE FOUND TO BE UNLAWFUL OR UNENFORCEABLE BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION, THEN THE REMAINDER OF THIS AGREEMENT WILL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AND THE PARTIES WILL IMMEDIATELY COMMENCE NEGOTIATIONS TO REPLACE THE INVALIDATED PROVISION WITH A COMPARABLE, LEGAL CLAUSE.

ALL PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE SUBJECT TO THE RATIFICATION BY THE SUFFOLK COUNTY CORRECTION OFFICERS ASSOCIATION, INC. , AND THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND THE SUFFOLK COUNTY SHERIFF, AND WILL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE RATIFICATION HAS OCCURRED.

IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT ANY PROVISION OF THIS AGREEMENT REQUIRING LEGISLATIVE ACTION TO PERMIT ITS IMPLEMENTATION BY AMENDMENT OF LAW OR BY PROVIDING THE ADDITIONAL FUNDS THEREFOR, SHALL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNTIL THE APPROPRIATE LEGISLATIVE BODY HAS GIVEN APPROVAL.



ABSTRACT

As attention to the potential for cyber-attacks across industries and municipalities has grown, the need for individuals trained in cybersecurity to protect the nation's information systems, networks, and infrastructure has never been greater. This is evident in cybersecurity jobs growing at twice the rate of all other IT jobs combined. At the same time the potential vulnerabilities in the nation's information infrastructure carry implications for the sustainability of the nation's energy infrastructure. In response, this ATE project will i) engage in the design and creation a new seamless pathway from high school through college in cybersecurity and ii) enhance its existing sustainability programs.

Specific goals of this project are to: 1) Increase the capacity to grow and train an advanced technological workforce in cybersecurity; 2) create a seamless pathway for inquiry-based learning for STEM students, with attention to increased participation of underrepresented students, from high school through college; 3) engage and expand the number of minority and non-traditional students in cybersecurity and sustainability programs at the College; and 4) foster regional collaboration among industry, higher education, secondary schools. The cybersecurity degree will include stacked certifications, permitting both traditional students and professionals returning to college to enter and exit the program

flexibly and to obtain certifications while "stacking" those certifications towards the degree, or to complete the program traditionally and exit after two years with a degree and the certifications. Thus, the program will benefit both new students and existing professionals looking to upgrade their skills and obtain additional academic and workplace credentials.

1. Petitioner has been organized for the general purposes of carrying freight, baggage and all other merchandise and transportable matter for hire over and upon the waters of the Great South Bay, for cross bay service between ferry terminals located at Sayville, New York and the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island all of which lie within the County of Suffolk.

2. Petitioner hereby requests that the Legislature of the County of Suffolk grant Petitioner a ferry license and franchise for the service requested herein in the usual form commencing on the date of approval and ending December 15, 2020.

3. Petitioner is a ferry corporation organized under the Transportation Corporations Law of the State of New York with its principal office at 68 River Road, Sayville, New York.

4. Petitioner proposes to provide service between which the ferry service operations are to be conducted as follows:

(a) From a dock located on the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to Fire Island Pines in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return;

(b) From a dock located on the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to Cherry Grove in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return;

(c) From a dock located on the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to Davis Park in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return; and

(d) From a dock located on the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to Water Island in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return.

5. Petitioner confirms that the vessel to be employed by the Petitioner in the performance of said ferry service will be kept in the County of Suffolk.

6. The vessel intended to be used by Petitioner in the performance of said ferry service is known as the M/V Provider, O.N. 1190836, 14 gross tons, freight only.

The petition of Beachcomber Freight Service, LLC d/b/a Coastline Freight respectfully shows:

1. Petitioner has been organized for the general purposes of carrying freight, baggage and all other merchandise and transportable matter for hire over and upon the waters of the Great South Bay, for cross bay service between ferry terminals located at Sayville, New York and the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island, all of which lie within the County of Suffolk.

2. Petitioner hereby makes this application pursuant to Section 131(g) of the Highway Law of the State of New York and Local Law No. 7-1982, Chapter 287, Section 3, of Suffolk County for the establishment of ferry service tariff rates by the Legislature of the County of Suffolk in connection with the Petitioner's proposed ferry service for the purpose of transporting freight for hire between ferry terminals located at Sayville, New York and the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island, all of which lie within the County of Suffolk.

3. Petitioner has simultaneously filed a separate petition with the Legislature of the County of Suffolk requesting that the Legislature of the County of Suffolk grant Petitioner a ferry license and franchise for the purpose of transporting freight for hire between ferry terminals located at Sayville, New York and the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island, in the usual form commencing on the date of approval and ending December 15, 2020.

4. Petitioner is a ferry corporation organized under the Transportation Corporations Law of the State of New York on [_____, 2014] and has been and remains in good standing under such law and is authorized to do business in the State of New York.

5. Petitioner proposes to charge the ferry tariff rates annexed hereto as Exhibit "A" in connection with Petitioner's requested ferry service for the purpose of transporting freight for hire between ferry terminals located at the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island, located in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return service.

6. The ferry tariff rates requested by Petitioner and annexed hereto as Exhibit "A" were previously approved by the Legislature of the County of Suffolk for Roncalli Freight Company Inc. ("Roncalli Freight") by Resolution No. 551-2011, approved on June 21, 2011, in connection with the operation by Roncalli Freight of ferry freight services also from the east side of River Road in the Hamlet of Sayville, Town of Islip, County of Suffolk, State of New York, to the Fire Island community of Fire Island Pines, located in the Town of Brookhaven, County of Suffolk, State of New York, and return service.

7. Local Law No. 7-1982, Chapter 287, Section 3, of Suffolk County requires a petition for the establishment of rates to be supported by a certified audited financial statement for each of the last two fiscal years, including a balance sheet (including net worth and retained earnings), profit and loss statements (stating all income and expenses), and a statement of changes in financial position. Petitioner has acquired the ferry freight service operations of Roncalli Freight and as a newly established operation without historical financial information, Petitioner has submitted to the Clerk of the Legislature of the County of Suffolk the following financial information in support of its application for the ferry freight service tariff rates annexed hereto as Exhibit "A":

- (i) Audited Financial Statements and Supplementary Information for the Roncalli Freight Group for the Year-Ended December 31, 2011;
- (ii) Audit Financial Statements and Supplementary Information for the Roncalli Freight Group for the Year-Ended December 31, 2012;

(iii) Unaudited Financial Information for Roncalli Freight for the year ended December 31, 2013 and for the partial year January 1, 2014 through October 31, 2014 (the date Petitioner acquired the ferry freight service operations of Roncalli Freight).

8. Petitioner believes that the ferry freight service license and franchise requested by Petitioner together with the requested ferry freight tariff rates will continue to provide the Fire Island communities of Fire Island Pines, Cherry Grove, Davis Park and Water Island with high-quality ferry freight service from Sayville, New York, and Petitioner believes that the requested ferry freight tariff rates are reasonable given that the requested ferry freight tariff rates were previously approved by the Legislature of the County of Suffolk for Roncalli Freight, applicable to the ferry freight service operated by Roncalli Freight from Sayville, New York to the Fire Island community of Fire Island Pines.





**RESOLUTION NO. - 2015, ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO.
-2015, A LOCAL LAW TO CLARIFY AFFORDABLE HOUSING
REQUIREMENTS**

WHEREAS, there was duly presented and introduced to this County Legislature at a meeting held on , 2015, a proposed local law entitled, "**A LOCAL LAW TO CLARIFY AFFORDABLE HOUSING REQUIREMENTS**" now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that said local law be enacted in form as follows:

LOCAL LAW NO. -2015, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK

**A LOCAL LAW TO CLARIFY AFFORDABLE HOUSING
REQUIREMENTS**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF
SUFFOLK**, as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

This Legislature hereby finds and determines that the lack of affordable housing is one of the major contributors to the "brain drain" and one of the chief obstacles to economic growth in Suffolk County.

This Legislature further finds that it is the longstanding policy of the County of Suffolk to actively encourage the creation of affordable workforce housing; accordingly, this Legislature has enacted a series of laws designed to encourage the construction of affordable housing units.

This Legislature also finds that Local Law No. 20-2007 requires developers of residential housing, who seek to connect with an existing County sewer district from outside the district, to set aside at least 20% of the proposed development units for affordable housing.

This Legislature further finds that Local Law No. 20-2007 did not contemplate the construction of affordable units at a location separate and apart from the development connecting to a County sewer district and, therefore, does not directly address this particular situation.

This Legislature further finds that Local Law No. 20-2007 (codified in Chapter 740 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE) should be amended to clarify that the affordable units of a residential development connecting to a County sewer district should be constructed "onsite" but, in limited circumstances, this policy may be waived by Sewer Agency and the County Legislature.

Therefore, the purpose of this law is to amend Local Law No. 20-2007 to clarify the County's policy on affordable housing as it relates to residential developments connecting to a County sewer district.

Section 2. Amendments.

Chapter 740 of the SUFFOLK COUNTY CODE is hereby amended as follows:

CHAPTER 740: SEWERS

* * * *

Article VIII: General Provisions

* * * *

§ 740-45 Connection by premises outside district.

* * * *

C. Affordable housing considerations.

(1) No contract between the Administrator and an applicant from outside the geographical boundaries of a district may be entered into unless, in the case of a residential housing development or a development that includes a residential component, which consists of 10 or more units only, the housing development or component is comprised of no less than 20% of units that are set aside for homebuyers or renters whose income does not exceed 120% of the HUD-established median income limit for the Nassau-Suffolk Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area (PMSA) adjusted by family size. The affordable units shall be constructed at the site of the development that is connecting to a County sewer district facility. The Administrator may waive this requirement only in the event that town or village approval of the proposed housing development requires that some or all of the affordable units be constructed offsite, at another location within the town or village; in such case, the Administrator shall ensure that the agreement permitting connection of the applicant's project to a district requires that the affordable units be constructed and completed in a ratio of no less than one affordable unit for every four market-rate units, and that no discharge permits are issued for the market-rate units unless such ratio is maintained.

* * * *

Section 3. Applicability.

This law shall apply to applications for connections to a County sewer district received by the Suffolk County Sewer Agency on or after the effective date of this law. Additionally, the provisions of this law shall be given effect and apply to the application of Bayport Meadow Estates which was previously approved by the Suffolk County Sewer Agency by their Resolution No. 1-2015.

Section 4. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this law or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision,

section, or part of this law, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

Section 5. SEQRA Determination.

This Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21), and/or (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of State.

This proposed local law would clarify affordable housing requirements that are applicable to residential developments located outside of the boundaries of a County's sewer district, which seek to connect to such district.

Currently, a developer of a residential development (exceeding 10 units) cannot connect to a County sewer district unless he or she agrees to set aside at least 20% of the planned units for affordable housing.¹ However, the current law does not specifically address the situation where it's proposed that the affordable units be constructed "offsite", at a location separate and apart from the development that is connecting to the sewer district.


This law clarifies that residential developments connecting to a County sewer district must construct the required affordable units onsite, i.e. at the site of the development that is connecting to the sewer district. This rule maybe waived by the Sewer Agency and the County Legislature only if the town/village approval of the project is conditioned on the affordable units being constructed offsite.²

This law will apply to applications for connections to a County sewer district received by the Suffolk County Sewer Agency on or after the effective date of this law. Additionally, this law is given retroactive effect to apply to the application of Bayport Meadow Estates, a project that was previously approved for a sewer connection by the Suffolk County Sewer Agency by their Resolution No. 1-2015.

¹ The units must be set aside for homebuyers or renters whose income does not exceed 120% of the HUD- established median income limit for the Nassau-Suffolk Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area (PMSA) adjusted by family size.

² In the event a waiver is approved, the connection agreement will require the developer to construct and complete the affordable units in a ratio of no less than one affordable unit for every four market-rate units, and the Sewer Agency will not issue discharge permits for the market-rate units unless such ratio is maintained.

2nd **RESOLVED**, that it is hereby determined that this project, with a priority ranking of 79, is eligible for approval in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No.

471-1994 as revised by Resolution 571-1998 and reaffirmed by Resolution 209-2000; and be it further

The Department of Economic Development and Planning requests submittal of the attached resolution requesting an amendment to the 2015 Capital Budget to increase funds needed for CP 5739 and authorization to accept Federal Aviation Administration and NYS DOT grant awards.

CP 5739 provides funds for Airfield Pavement Management and Rehabilitation at Gabreski Airport. Financial assistance is provided by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and New York State Department of Transportation in the form of grants. The FAA contributes 90%; NY State's share is 5%, and the County's share is 5%.

FAA and NYSDOT funds for design were provided in 2013. Limited FAA construction funds were not available in 2014 but were recently identified by the FAA in 2015 if the project could be bid and constructed. During the design process, it was revealed that an additional \$1,366,812 was needed due to the extent of the needed repairs.

RESOLUTION NO. -2015, ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR THE REMOVAL OF ROADS FROM THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM AND THE APPORTIONMENT OF THE MAINTENANCE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH COUNTY SYSTEM ROADS

WHEREAS, decades ago certain roadways placed in the County Road System were owned by the towns or villages in which those roadways are situated; and

WHEREAS, duly authorized representatives from the towns and villages in Suffolk County requested that these roadways be placed in the County Road System to make those roadways eligible for State and federal aid that is only available to roadways in the County Road System; and

WHEREAS, under New York State Highway Law § 115-b, the County may remove a road or a part thereof from the County Road System;

WHEREAS, under New York State Highway Law § 129, the County may apportion the cost of maintenance between it and the towns or villages in which such roadways are located; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby declared to be the policy of the County that there be a uniform system for the removal of roads from the County Road System and for the maintenance and apportionment of costs of certain roads in the County Road System as set forth in an amendment to Chapter 847 of the County code; now therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that, Chapter 874 of the Suffolk County Code is hereby amended by the addition of a new Article II to read as follows:

**Chapter 874
Capital Projects**

ARTICLE II
County Road System

§ 874-1. Legislative Intent.

This Legislature finds and determines that the authorization for and establishment of a County Road System stems from a New York State Law initially enacted in 1893, which was intended to permit the development of road systems in counties throughout the State of New York by creating a system of state funding of county roadway development.

This Legislature further finds and determines that because of 1914 and 1929 amendments to this funding mechanism, roads that had been constructed and maintained by local municipalities (i.e. towns and incorporated villages) were ineligible for direct State and/or Federal Aid and could only avail themselves of this financial benefit if these road segments were included in the County Road System despite the fact that the local municipality where the road segment was located retained ownership and/or maintenance responsibilities of the subject road segment.

This Legislature further finds and determines that subsequent amendments to New York State and Federal laws, rules, and regulations now allows for direct New York State and/or Federal Highway aid to be directly distributed to local municipalities and that the prior inclusion of these roadway segments in the County Road System to secure said financing is no longer necessary.

This Legislature further finds and determines that New York State Highway Law Section 115-b permits the County and the local municipalities to enter into agreements removing said road segments from the County Road System. Resolution 825-2011 authorized the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works to take measures to remove certain roads from the Suffolk County Road System.

This Legislature further finds and determines that it was never the intention of the County of Suffolk to own or maintain the local municipal roads that were included in the County Road System for the purpose of obtaining New York State and/or Federal Aid.

This Legislature further finds and determines that Section 129 of the New York State Highway Law authorizes and permits the County of Suffolk to apportion the cost of maintenance between it and the local municipalities in which any County Road System road is located.

Therefore, the purpose of this resolution is to establish a uniform system for the removal of roads from the County Road System and for the maintenance and apportionment of costs of certain roads in the County Road System.

§ 874-2. Definitions.

Commissioner means the Commissioner of the Suffolk County Department of Public Works.

County Road System as used herein shall have the same meaning as used in Highway Law § 115, and any amendments thereto.

Maintenance means any design, construction, improvement, operation, maintenance, use, management, or any combination of the foregoing for any road in the County Road System.

§ 874-3. Removal of highways from County Road System.

In accordance with the provisions of New York State Highway Law § 115-b, the Commissioner may enter into any necessary written agreements with the governing body of any town or village for any roadway recommended and approved by the Legislature for removal from the County Road System, for the purpose of returning such roadway to the town or village in which it is situated. The Commissioner may make the necessary applications to the New York State Commissioner of Transportation for any such roadway that the Commissioner deems suitable to be removed from the County Road System and returned to the town or village in which it is situated.

§ 874-4. Apportionment of certain highway costs.

In accordance with New York State Highway Law § 129, the Commissioner may apportion the cost of maintenance between the County and the local municipalities in which any County Road System road is located for any fiscal year during which the County has borne, in whole or in part, the cost of maintenance of such road.

§ 874-5. Rules and regulations.

A.) The Commissioner is hereby authorized and empowered and directed to perform such acts and adopt such rules and regulations after the adoption of this Article that are deemed by him to be necessary and proper to reasonably apportion the costs of maintenance authorized under Code § 874-4, including, without limitation, the amount to be borne by the County and the local municipalities, respectively.

B.) No rule or regulation proposed under this Article shall be approved by the Commissioner until after he has held a public hearing. Notice thereof shall be given by posting conspicuously at the office of the Clerk of the Legislature, the County Clerk, the Commissioner, at the plaza level of the H. Lee Dennison Building and by publication in the official County papers. Such notice shall state the time when and the place where the Commissioner shall convene for such hearing, which will be during regularly scheduled business hours. In any event, the posting and publication shall be not less than three days nor more than 15 days before the date of the hearing. In the case of the notice by posting, a copy of the rules and regulations shall be attached; and in the case of the published notice, a synopsis shall be provided.

§ 874-6. Judicial review.

The action of the Commissioner in apportioning costs may be reviewed by a proceeding brought under and pursuant to Article 78 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules of the State of New York.

2rd RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this law constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.59(c)(20) and (27) of Title 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-109 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection. Furthermore, in accordance with Section 1-4(A)(1)(d) of the Suffolk County Charter and Section 279-5(C)(4) of the Suffolk County Code, the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality is directed to prepare and circulate all appropriate notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this law.
