

**RE: RESOLUTION 1058-2009; APPROPRIATING FUNDS IN CONNECTION WITH ESTABLISHMENT OF A DOG PARK AT SOUTHAVEN COUNTY PARK (CP 7065)**

Dear Presiding Officer Lindsay and Members of the Legislature:

I am returning herein **RESOLUTION 1058-2009; APPROPRIATING FUNDS IN CONNECTION WITH ESTABLISHMENT OF A DOG PARK AT SOUTHAVEN COUNTY PARK (CP 7065)** vetoed in its entirety.

I have been an ardent, vocal and strong supporter of dog parks in Suffolk County. In fact, I have led the charge to their establishment in several county parks. Under my direction, the Parks Department has been aggressively identifying additional sites suitable for this purpose. However, we must ensure that the needs of all park users are respected and balanced and that the safety of non dog owners is also ensured. In addition, we must evaluate the extraordinary costs associated with this particular dog park in the face of one of the toughest budgetary years we have experienced in recent memory. The Parks' Department estimate that this dog park will cost upwards of \$90,000 is an expense that Suffolk County taxpayers simply cannot afford. By contrast, the natural borders dog park we opened just two miles away at the Robinson Duck Farm cost a mere \$6,000.

In March 2009, the Parks Trustees advised against this resolution and noted that "there is a need by [Parks] Operations to utilize Southaven County Park for other park uses and cannot afford to lose the location for a dog park." I agree that this location is unsuitable.

Additionally, establishing a dog park at Southaven County Park at this time is premature because the necessary environmental reviews, including a SEQRA determination, have yet to be completed. These important steps have been created to ensure that a full vetting of locations would be completed and should continue to be followed.



In order to be responsive to the needs of dog owners in Suffolk County, it is expected that the new natural borders dog park at the Robinson Duck Farm in southeastern Brookhaven created this year will serve as a model for a cheaper alternative to the other dog parks that have been discussed while also satisfying the desires of the constituency it is intended to serve.

When I first envisioned the concept of dog runs in our county, it was for very simple fenced off areas. Since then, the parks have included water hook-ups, paved parking areas and synthetic flooring. These extras are both expensive and unnecessary, especially in these difficult financial times.

For the reasons enumerated above, I strongly urge the legislature to heed the advice of the Suffolk County Parks Trustees and sustain my veto of this resolution.

**RESOLUTION NO. 1058 -2009, APPROPRIATING FUNDS  
IN CONNECTION WITH ESTABLISHMENT OF A DOG PARK  
AT SOUTHAVEN COUNTY PARK (CP 7065)**

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 566-1998 authorized the Commissioner of the County Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation to construct dog runs for the use of families with pet dogs within West Hills County Park and dog runs for the use of families in such other separate County facilities as deemed appropriate; and

**WHEREAS**, dog runs and/or dog parks have since been established at West Hills County Park in Huntington, Blydenburgh County Park in Smithtown, and on the grounds of Coindre Hall in the Town of Huntington; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 461-2007 directed the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation to identify locations at five (5) County properties that could be used as dog parks; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 143-2009 authorized the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation to plan and design a dog park at Southaven County Park; and

**WHEREAS**, there are sufficient funds within the 2009 Capital Budget and Program to cover the cost of said request under Capital Program Number 7065; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 471-1994, as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006 established the use of a priority ranking system, implemented in the Adopted 2008 Capital Budget, as the basis for funding capital projects such as this project; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that it is hereby determined that this project, with a priority ranking of 30 is eligible for approval in accordance with the provisions of Resolution No. 471-1994 as revised by Resolution No. 571-1998, Resolution No. 209-2000 and Resolution No. 461-2006; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that prior to the adoption of a bond authorization by this Legislature and any expenditure or commitment of said funds for this project, an environmental review shall be completed in accordance with SEQRA by the County of Suffolk; and be it further

**3<sup>rd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the proceeds of \$50,000 in Suffolk County Serial Bonds be and they hereby are appropriated as follows:
