(THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 12:32 P.M.)

CHAIRPERSON HAHN:

Welcome. All Legislators to the horseshoe. Welcome to the Legislature's Parks & Recreation Committee. If we could all -- if we could all stand for the pledge led by Legislator Kennedy.

(Salutation)

CHAIRPERSON HAHN:

I don't have any cards. Do we have any cards? We just got a card. Bring it on down. Lance Reinheimer.

PUBLIC PORTION

MR. REINHEIMER:

Good afternoon. Lance Reinheimer --

CHAIRPERSON HAHN:

Good afternoon, Lance.

MR. REINHEIMER:

-- executive director of the Vanderbilt Museum here again. I hope -- I hope this is one of the last times I see you for a while. I know sometimes you get a little -- you wonder why I keep coming back asking for money. But anyway, things keep coming up in the capital program.

I met with Public Works about a month ago to discuss an issue that came up when the fire marshal inspected our planetarium. They were a little concerned about our front doors which are 40 years old. They're not ADA compliant; we have problems locking them; we have problems having them open. Especially the fire marshal's concerned for safety, fire safety, and we had to retrofit and put on pins and locks that are not original to the door, and they don't like that. So, I talked to Public Works. They felt the best way to proceed was to appropriate funds from Capital Project 7454, which is safety improvements at Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum. So, this is a perfect match. That's a general project for the whole campus to improve and bring buildings up to current building code as it pertains to safety for our visitors and for our employees. So, they're looking to replace the front doors using this and to satisfy the concerns of the fire marshal. This is part of the regular capital program. This appropriates \$200,000 for construction. I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRPERSON HAHN:

We have a question. Legislator Kennedy.

LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:

Lance, are these the big wooden doors?

1 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
2 No. They're aluminum doors. They're commercial -- like you would
3 have found on a store 40 years ago, aluminum glass doors. There's
4 two sets. There's an airlock. So, they're replacing the front
5 doors and the inside doors.

6
7 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
8 In the planetarium?

9
10 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
11 To the planetarium.

12
13 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
14 Oh, all right, okay.

15
16 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
17 Yes. These are planetarium doors.

18
19 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
20 All right, thank you.

21
22 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
23 I want to make that clear. And it came about because of the
24 inspection from the fire marshal. We've got the doors so they
25 work. I don't want you to think that there's any safety issues
26 now, but we've been looking to replace the doors anyway. This kind
27 of -- kind of accelerates our request for replacing the doors.

28
29 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
30 And appropriating the money at this time does not take away from
31 any other project?

32
33 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
34 No. This is -- this project is for safety improvements at the
35 Vanderbilt Museum.

36
37 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
38 Okay.

39
40 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
41 So, it's general, generic, and it's to address building-code issues
42 as they pertain to safety for our visitors and for our staff.

43
44 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
45 Okay. Thank you.

46
47 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
48 Any other questions? Okay, thank you --

49
50 **MR. REINHEIMER:**
51 Thank you very much.

52
53 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
54 -- for all you do for the Vanderbilt. Okay, that was my one and
55 only card that I had here. Was there anyone else in the audience
56 who would like to speak? Seeing none, we will close the Public

1 Portion. We have no presentations today. We'll move on to

39 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
40 **Motion by Legislator McCaffrey. Seconded by Legislator Lindsay.**

41
42 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
43 **On the motion.**

44
45 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
46 **On the motion, Legislator Kennedy. We have the Commissioner here.**
47 **Welcome, Commissioner Berdolt.**

48
49 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
50 **Good afternoon.**

51
52 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**
53 **Good afternoon, Commissioner. Just asking, what exactly are we**
54 **buying?**

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 The list is long.

3
4 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

5 Okay.

6
7 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

8 Well, we just had a compressor go down at Smith's Point. So, we
9 were hoping to use our Smith's Point money, but we can't. We have
10 -- we need to use equipment. So, that's a 30,000-dollar buy right
11 there for two compressors. Also, there's multiple Gators that we
12 need to purchase. I'd love to get another ShowMobile, but that's
13 something I think I'm going to have to look for in a separate CP
14 just for another -- another year just because I'd like to do a
15 little comparison to see if we can actually make some more money on
16 it, which I think there's a need for. I think we're booked up
17 solid all the time and our one -- anyway, and that would be 175
18 right there in one shot. So, you know, there's multiple equipment
19 that we need, and, like I said, the list is long, anywhere from
20 tractors to Gators to small dump trucks.

21
22 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

23 Okay. But we're only appropriating 200,000.

24
25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 I know, right.

27
28 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

29 So, what, 30 and 30 is 60 and then --

30
31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 Well, you know, if we got -- you know, at 12,000 a Gator, you know,
33 if we got eight Gators, you know, it's gonna go fast.

34
35 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

36 Yes, it is. Thanks.

37
38 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

39 Okay. So, stay there. Don't go anywhere.

40
41 We have a motion and a second. All those in favor? Opposed?
42 Abstentions? **1496 is approved. (Vote: 4-0-0-1. Legislator Stern**
43 **not present.)**

44
45 I'm going to use the Chair's prerogative just while you're at the
46 podium. I should have brought you up earlier. You want to tell us
47 a little bit about the season now that, you know, Memorial Day is
48 past and you're into midway through June, and are there -- how's
49 everything going with reservation system for camping, and how's the
50 -- how is everything going?

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 Well, this'll be my first summer, so I can't have anything to
54 compare it to. Just from what -- talking with staff, I think we're
55 off to -- we're off to an okay season. It was a little -- the
56 weather didn't cooperate in the beginning. So, on Memorial Day

1 Weekend wasn't that great. We were down in our numbers, but that's
2 the name of the game with this. It's all about the weather. You
3 know, our season depends on weather. You know, good summer with
4 good weather is going to bring in some higher numbers as far as the
5 gates and everything else. As far as our facilities, we're doing
6 quite well. We did a lot of work at Smith's Point this year in --
7 for the bathrooms, getting them fixed up and some of the campsites.
8 The Rec Track system is still a work in progress. We have been
9 pretty successful on taking it apart from the back end, sort of
10 speak and trying to reprogram it, taking out some of the issues
11 that we've been finding. We're still working on that. We have
12 created or we're in the process of creating what we call a sandbox
13 operation, which will be -- we're going to run a parallel system
14 with it. So, we're redoing it to see if this -- if the new
15 programming works any better, and we're hoping to get that done
16 before the end of the season and run it. We have engaged the
17 vendor, Vermont Systems, a little bit more than, I guess, in the
18 past and kind of held them to task on a lot of this stuff that
19 isn't operating correctly. So, they've been very helpful. And --

20
21 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

22 Have you been engaging -- oh, I see the representative from the
23 Committee for Camping. I can't remember the full name of the
24 group.

25
26 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
27 Camping?

28
29 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
30 Campers Group. Have you been engaging them on this system?

31
32 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
33 With Rec Track system?

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
36 Yeah. On the reservation system issues.

37
38 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
39 I don't think so. I don't think we've -- no.

40
41 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
42 Okay. No, I just --

43
44 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**
45 It's more of an IT issue than it is for -- I mean, it is
46 cumbersome. So, there is no doubt about that.

47
48 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**
49 Right. And I think that there were some good -- when I met with
50 them, I think there were some good ideas that they had about -- if
51 you were -- if you were -- and this is my -- testing my memory
52 because it was several months ago, but if when people do cancel
53 reservations, you know, making those cancelations even if they're
54 group sites or whatever, you know, getting it out there so that
55 other people can reserve them once they've been canceled it might
56 help just fill the slots more often, and I might not be remembering

1 exactly right, but, you know, I think there's some -- there's some
2 ideas that they had that might help from a revenue side, and it
3 just would be useful for you to talk to them.

4
5 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

6 Well, we did change the seven day, was it, to two days for the
7 reservations, you know, because I -- some of these things you look
8 at and you're wondering why it was done this way.

9
10 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

11 Right.

12
13 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

14 A lot of the issues we have also is the multiple-fee structure,
15 that the system can't handle it as well. So, that's something we
16 may also look into changing.

17
18 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

19 And I don't -- and I don't know that you have to meet at your
20 level, but whoever's managing at the staff level --

21
22 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

23 Right. When we look at the cards -- like, when somebody leaves,
24 they can fill out a questionnaire card, and we do look at them and,
25 you know, discuss it, and -- you know, if there are some good
26 suggestions. Plus social media is out there and --

27
28 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

29 Yes, it is.

30
31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 -- they're very, very vocal, which is fine, you know.

33
34 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

35 Right. No, they had some good ideas, and I hope someone from the
36 staff that's dealing with the system will talk to them.

37
38 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

39 Right. Any time, you know, either the LIBBA people or the
40 Committee for Camping --

41
42 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

43 Right.

44
45 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

46 You know, we're always entertaining them and try to meet with them
47 whenever we can.

48
49 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

50 Good. Okay, thank you. I appreciate your allowing me those
51 questions. Anyone else while he's up there?

52
53 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

54 Any plover questions?

1 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

2 Kara just brought up the finances. Do we take statistics on the
3 amount of cars that drive in or the amount of people that have to
4 pay at each of our parks?

5
6 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

7 Where they pay, yes, through our POS system and Vermont -- we're
8 able to take numbers on that, yes

9
10 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

11 Okay. So, can we get some information on particular parks in our
12 district?

13
14 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

15 Depending on what kind of information you're looking for.

16
17 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

18 Lake Ronkonkoma parks on the weekends.

19
20 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

21 That is not in the P -- right? That's not in the POS system. It
22 is? Okay, all right. So, for how many cars are parked there on
23 the weekends?

24
25 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

26 No, no. For how many people pay. When you have a thousand people
27 on the beach --

28
29 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

30 It's only paid for the car.

31
32 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

33 It's only paid for the car, correct. I just want to see how many
34 cars are pay.

35
36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 Okay.

38
39 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

40 All right?

41
42 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

43 Good.

44
45 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

46 Thanks.

47
48 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

49 People can walk in there too though, right?

50
51 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

52 Correct. And they do. A lot of --

53
54 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

55 It's a neighborhood sort of location as well.

56

1 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

2 They --

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 They flood the neighborhood.

6
7 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

8 -- flood the neighborhood.

9
10 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

11 Right.

12
13 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

14 And park in front of fire hydrants and people's driveways, yeah.

15
16 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

17 I see.

18
19 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

20 It's an issue.

21
22 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

23 Presiding Officer Gregory.

24
25 **PRESIDING OFFICER GREGORY:**

26 Thank you, Ms. Chair and -- Madam Chair, excuse me, and
27 Mr. Commissioner, I'm curious, I guess kinda piggyback on
28 Legislator Kennedy's question, do we have survey or demographic
29 data on our visitors in the park, like, primarily -- I mean, I
30 guess one assumption can be people visit the park that's nearest
31 them, but I'm curious to see if we have people from New York City
32 or Nassau County, why they're coming to a particular park, and, you
33 know, maybe that can enhance -- we can use that information to
34 enhance how we advertise, you know, or promote our parks.

35
36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 I don't think we -- we can't capture that information. The only
38 thing we can give you is Green Key or non-Green Key, and if it's a
39 non-Green Key they could be a Suffolk County resident but just
40 never purchased a Green Key. So, we don't have any way of telling.
41 We can only say whether it's a resident fee or a nonresident fee,
42 and that's only for parking. We don't have any other ways, and the
43 only thing I think we do is we try and figure -- what is it, two
44 point something per car and try and get a number on the amount of
45 people that visit the park by that.

46
47 **PRESIDING OFFICER GREGORY:**

48 Have we thought about maybe collaborating with, like, Stony Brook
49 or a local college and, you know -- youngster with the clipboard
50 kind of --

51
52 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

53 Going around capturing a survey? No, that's never been brought up,
54 not to my knowledge. Maybe it has. I don't know.

55

1 **PRESIDING OFFICER GREGORY:**

2 Okay, all right. Thank you.

3
4 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

5 Okay. Any other questions? Great. We were up to 1501.
