3 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

4 Okay, everybody, welcome to the Legislature's Parks and Recreation
5 Committee. If we could all rise for a salute to the flag led by
6 Bill Lindsay.

7
8 (Salutation)
9

10 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

11 Madam Clerk, do we have any cards?
12

13 **MS. ELLIS:**

14 No, ma'am.
15

16 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

17 We have no cards. Is there anyone in the audience who would like
18 to address the Committee? Seeing none, we will close the Public
19 Portion. We have no presentations today, no tabled resolutions.
20

21 Maybe if the Commissioner would like to come up before we get into
22 introductory resolutions, if we can just hear what's going on in
23 the peak summer season.
24

25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 Well, as my first summer here, I'm assuming everything seems to be
27 running smoothly. I'll give you a better take on it next summer,
28 but it does. It seems to be going well. I'm very happy and
29 pleased with the staff, I'm pleased with the numbers on the
30 revenues that are coming in.
31

32 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

33 How are our numbers in attendance? Is that what you're talking
34 about, you're pleased with those numbers compared to other years?
35

36 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

37 Yeah. It was a slow start weather-wise. So, our main numbers were
38 down due to weather, but we're coming back nicely.
39

40 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

41 And --
42

43 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

44 I think the efforts that we're doing over as Smith Point with the
45 outer beach is having a tremendous effect on attendance in a
46 positive way because we're able to keep the beach open for the
47 first time since post Sandy.
48

49 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

50 Excellent. Thank you for all your work. And I toured Smith Point
51 again with Legislator Browning, and I really noticed a difference
52 in how the bathrooms appeared and the showers and at the campsites.
53 They clearly had been freshly painted this season and were much
54 cleaner than I had seen the last time I had toured them. You know,
55 I'm not there every weekend, but when we toured we made a special
56 effort to check those things out. I think there was one door in a

1 bathroom that was missing a lock and another door missing.
2 Hopefully those things will be addressed.

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 Yeah. They're continuing issues.

6
7 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

8 Yes.

9
10 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

11 Every day something new.

12
13 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

14 Right.

15
16 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

17 We address them as we can. You know, the worst complaints we get
18 is a leaky faucet. I'll live with that. Every time I go by there,
19 I go through every bathroom - obviously the men's room only - and
20 check, and they're -- I'm very pleased with the staff there and the
21 work they're doing. Just the smell of cleanliness is very apparent
22 when you go in there. At all different times I've been there it's
23 always -- it's been nice.

24
25 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

26 Right. There was a leaky shower on the campground. That can lead
27 to other rusting issues. You know, so, hopefully continual
28 maintenance will address that. How about staff on the East End? I
29 know there were some problems being able to staff some of the
30 positions, seasonal positions on the East End. Some of the
31 rationale --

32
33 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

34 We still have those issues.

35
36 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

37 We still have those issues?

38
39 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

40 Yes.

41
42 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

43 So, how do you market those positions?

44
45 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

46 We did a pretty good campaign through our own Parks website through
47 the County website. Also, Legislator Fleming and Legislator
48 Krupski put stuff up on their Facebook page or websites looking for
49 people. We also had some of our staff go out to Riverhead, and I
50 believe they were even in East Hampton at their career days for the
51 kids. You know, it's tough to compete when the kids are out there
52 working in restaurants, you know, making a lot of money, you know,
53 to come and get a weed whacker, you know. It's not easy getting
54 people out there.

1 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

2 It's not easy, but restaurant work is tough, so.

3
4 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

5 We've moved around some staff -- yeah. One of our staff members
6 got hurt, and he just came back today on the East End. So, that's
7 a big plus. So, we're happy to have him back working out there.

8
9 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

10 Okay. And it's sort of a minimum-wage type of thing too, right?

11
12 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

13 Well, it's a little bit above.

14
15 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

16 A little bit above, okay.

17
18 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

19 Because of that, we went up. We're at \$10 an hour starting, and
20 then it progresses up as the years go on from a park aide --

21
22 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

23 But are you still hiring if anyone were --

24
25 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

26 Absolutely.

27
28 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

29 So --

30
31 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

32 We had the problem out at Cedar Beach out in Southold, and I saw
33 their staff at Cornell there and, you know, asked them if they knew
34 anybody, you know, anybody's kids that want a job.

35
36 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

37 Right. So, if our newspaper's listening we're looking for seasonal
38 employment on the East End. Okay, ticks, I know ticks have been an
39 issue in our parks. This is a particularly bad summer because of
40 the warm winter. Are you able to tell the Committee what -- how
41 the Parks Department addresses that?

42
43 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

44 Well, there's nothing that we can do. You know, I think maybe as
45 you may or may not know what is going on with Public Works and
46 vector control, that we did start that program, but it's only a
47 surveillance program. Anything that we do as far as -- I'm not a
48 hundred percent sure, but I think if we do anything that will
49 relate to any kind of control we'd need a CEQ which would -- and to
50 get a plan approved by CEQ could be a very, very expensive task,
51 and I think surveillance of ticks could be very expensive also.
52 So, that's a -- you know, it's all a funding issue, I would assume.

53
54 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

55 Also, in some cases, you know, for the safety of our visitors
56 maintenance of trails is important.

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 Yeah. We cut the trails back, and we cut the grass. But, you
3 know, you go hiking in the woods --

4
5 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

6 Sure, sure.

7
8 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

9 -- you're --

10
11 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

12 But when the trails aren't maintained, there is -- you know, there
13 are problems. So, you know, I understand staffing is low but
14 making sure that we're prioritizing where grass grows tall near
15 walking trails is important from a tick-control perspective and the
16 protection of our visitors. But thank you, I know how hard it is.
17 Any other questions for the Commissioner? Nope. Thank you so much
18 for --

19
20 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

21 Legislator Kennedy, it's nice to see you back.

22
23 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

24 Thank you.

25
26 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

27 I know we're all happy to have her back. Thank you for all your
28 work. Like I said, we've really seen a difference and heard from a
29 number of advocates about the difference that you're making in the
30 Department. So, we appreciate your work.

31
32 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

33 Thank you.

34
35 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

36 And I enjoy working with you. Thank you.

37
38 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

39 Same here. Thank you.

40
41 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

42 Okay. No other questions. We'll move on to introductory
43 resolutions.

44
45 **INTRODUCTORY RESOLUTIONS**

46
47 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

48 **1540 - Authorizing use of the Suffolk County Environmental Center**
49 **by the Rotary Club of Bay Shore for its Fall Kick-Off Gala**
50 **Fundraiser. (County Executive) Parks and Recreation (LOT 6/20/17**
51 **EXP 12/20/17) I'll make a motion. Second by Legislator Kennedy.**
52 **All those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 1540 is approved.**
53 **(Vote: 3-0-0-2. Legislators McCaffrey and Stern not present.)**

54
55 **Introductory Resolution 1558 - Authorizing use of Old Field Farm**
56 **for the Three Village Chamber of Commerce's 18th Annual Family**

1 **Beach Barbeque. (Hahn) Parks and Recreation (LOT 6/20/17 EXP**
2 **12/20/17) I'll make a motion. Seconded by Legislator Lindsay.**
3 **All those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 1558 is approved.**
4 **(Vote: 3-0-0-2. Legislators McCaffrey and Stern not present.)**
5

6 **Introductory Resolution 1567 - Amending the 2017 Capital Budget and**
7 **Program and appropriating funds in connection with Fencing and**
8 **Surveying Various County Parks (CP 7007). (Calarco) Parks and**
9 **Recreation (LOT 6/20/17 EXP 12/20/17) I'll make a motion.**
10 **Seconded by Legislator Lindsay. Motion to table by Legislator**
11 **Kennedy. I guess I can second the motion to table. I'll second**
12 **the motion to table. On the motion, do you want to ask a question?**
13

14 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

15 I do. I usually don't get crazy over this but reading this bill
16 made me nuts over the weekend. We want to bond out for \$8,000 for
17 a fence and maybe some surveying at Mud Creek. So, I know we
18 bought the Mud Creek area, and I would assume we surveyed it before
19 we bought it. I'm not understanding --
20

21 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

22 This was -- in the beginning of the season, Legislator Calarco was
23 looking to get this area fenced off because it's an open run for
24 dogs down at the beach and looking to fence off a specific area so
25 that the residents wouldn't have to interact with any dogs that are
26 -- this is our only off-leash area where dogs can swim, and at the
27 time our funding was low in the fencing because all the work we
28 were doing at Smith Point to hopefully, you know, keep Burma Road
29 open, and I think we had to buy triple the amount of snow fence,
30 and we had to buy silt fence. So, our funds were low. In order to
31 get this, this was the Legislature putting in extra money so we
32 could fence off that area.
33

34 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

35 So, what you're telling me is in our fencing/surveying budget we
36 have nothing. We don't have \$8,000.
37

38 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

39 We do now. At the time, we did not. We were using the funds. We
40 were expending the funds out. Besides, some work that we had to do
41 at West Hills with fencing. So, we were very, very low in that
42 area.
43

44 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

45 And you have it now because we bonded out for it or because during
46 this last budget it was put in?
47

48 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

49 Since that, we did get additional funds, since the original
50 request. We increased that line. So, yes, this can be tabled, and
51 I can speak with the Legislature.
52

53 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

54 Yeah. I would prefer that to happen because in good conscience if
55 we can't find \$8,000 in a department then we should just close up
56 shop.

1 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

2 Have you seen the budget?

3
4 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

5 I have. I've seen it all, and I know you do a fine job, and it's
6 not you. But 8,000 is -- I know someone bonds, you know, under
7 250,000, and, you know, I try not to be like this, but this is nuts
8 - bonding out for \$8,000 - in my opinion, but we'll table it, and
9 we'll find a better answer. Thank you.

10
11 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

12 Okay.

13
14 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

15 We have a motion to table and a second. We also have a motion to
16 approve and a second, but the motion to table goes first. Okay,
17 because when I -- when I moved my -- I went with the table. I get
18 it. I can't second or whatever both, okay, all right. But the
19 motion to table, all those in favor? Opposed? **It is tabled.**
20 **(Vote: 3-0-0-2. Legislators McCaffrey and Stern not present.)**

21
22 **Introductory Resolution 1569 - Amending the 2017 Capital Budget and**
23 **Program and accepting 100% grant funding from the Federal Emergency**
24 **Management Agency (FEMA) and New York State De-partment of Homeland**
25 **Security and Emergency Services (DHSES) and appropriating said**
26 **funding in connection with the purchase of heavy duty and other**
27 **equipment for County Parks (CP 7011). (County Executive) Parks and**
28 **Recreation (LOT 6/20/17 EXP 12/20/17) I'll make a motion to**
29 **approve and place on the consent calendar. Seconded by Legislator**
30 **Lindsay. All those in favor? On the motion, Legislator Kennedy.**

31
32 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

33 I'm being bothersome today. I apologize.

34
35 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

36 No bother.

37
38 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

39 This is from March 2010?

40
41 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

42 Correct, yes. It was a storm, and it didn't have a name, but it --
43 they gave it a number, DR1899.

44
45 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

46 Yeah. Because Sandy was in 2012. So, it's still eligible to be
47 given to us?

48
49 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

50 Yes. They're calling it an alternative project because we were
51 eligible for the funds. We were eligible for the funds, and then
52 when Sandy came through and destroyed more of the beach the
53 restoration was done through the FIMI project, but they still said
54 that we are entitled to the funds. So, we are taking them.

1 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

2 Okay. So, what heavy-duty equipment and other equipment are we
3 getting out of this?

4
5 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

6 The list should have been sent out. If you did not get one, we can
7 send you one.

8
9 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

10 Could you, please?

11
12 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

13 This is -- it's going to be divvied up County wide. So, we are --
14 and it's only for emergency response equipment. That was the
15 caveat of the -- of the grant. So, it's going between Police,
16 Probation -- yeah, I have it, Police, Probation, Sheriff, DPW, FRES
17 and Parks.

18
19 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

20 Okay. So, it's -- the capital project is for County parks the way
21 it's listed. It's not listed for Police and FRES. It's listed as
22 for heavy duty and other equipment for --

23
24 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

25 Correct. But it was for emergency -- the -- in order to get it, it
26 was only for emergency response equipment. So, this is all
27 emergency response equipment on here, whether it's emergency
28 service unit trucks, which are very expensive, payloaders.

29
30 **LEGISLATOR KENNEDY:**

31 Okay. If you would just send me a list, that would be great. You
32 have one, Katie?

33
34 **MS. HORST:**

35 We'll e-mail it out today so you have it. It's a hundred vehicles.

36
37 **COMMISSIONER BERDOLT:**

38 Or a hundred pieces of equipment.

39
40 **MS. HORST:**

41 Sorry. A hundred pieces of equipment.

42
43 **CHAIRPERSON HAHN:**

44 Thank you. We have a motion and a second. All those in favor?
45 Opposed? Abstentions? **1569 is approved. (Placed on Consent**
46 **Calendar. Vote: 3-0-0-2. Legislators McCaffrey and Stern not**
47 **present.)**

48
49 **Introductory Resolution 1571 - Authorizing use of Montauk County**
50 **Park in Montauk by Neo-Political Cowgirls for its Andromeda Dance**
51 **Theater Performance Fundraiser. (Fleming) Parks and Recreation (LOT**
52 **6/20/17 EXP 12/20/17) Motion by Legislator Lindsay. Seconded by**
53 **myself. All those in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? 1571 is**
54 **approved. (Vote: 3-0-0-2. Legislators McCaffrey and Stern not**
55 **present.)**
