(*The meeting was called to order at 3:11 P.M.*)

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay, all please rise for the Pledge of Allegiance to be led by Legislator O'Leary.

Salutation

If we could all please remain standing. A dear friend and colleague of ours recently passed away, Phyllis McAlevey. Some of us had attended the wake service today and yesterday. And she was a fine, fine friend and a colleague who always went out of her way to help those who worked here in the Legislature and had a great sense of humor that helped to smooth over things at times that were rather turbulent. So she's a person that we dearly miss and if we could just have a moment of silence in her memory.

Moment of Silence Observed

Okay, thank you. I'd like to welcome everyone to today's Public Works & Transportation Committee meeting. The chair of the committee, Legislator Caracappa, is, in fact, attending the services, the wake of Phyllis McAlevey, that's why he's not here today so, of course, he should be registered as an excused absence. Is there anyone from the public that wishes to speak? Hearing none, Commissioner, could you step forward. Hi, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:
Hello.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Before we get to the agenda, do any of my colleagues have any district issues to bring up with the Commissioner, or County wide issues regarding Public Works?

LEG. LINDSDAY
I have some, I just can't remember.

LEG. O'LEARY:
I know I have some but I'm not going to bring them up.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Okay. Well, we had discussed earlier --

LEG. GULDI:
I'll wait for them.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
-- Commissioner, the department did a wonderful job on Woodside Avenue with some repavement and restriping also along North Ocean Avenue. I would ask you to look at the overpasses of County Road 19 and North Ocean Avenue in the Sunrise Highway area where there's a need for some restriping there, and that would go a long way to help the traffic safety in that particular area.

LEG. LINDSAY:
(Inaudible).

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Yes. As Legislator Lindsay reminded, the department should be commended for the excellent work you had completed with the sidewalks along the Holbrook community area of County Road 19, so that the -- Legislator Lindsay and myself, as well as the Chamber of Commerce who worked diligently on that for a period of time, we want to thank you for helping to make that a safer roadway for pedestrians.

So with that said, any other business? Okay, let's get right to the agenda. Okay.

Introductory Resolutions

1296-03 - A Local Law to establish policy for connection by premises outside Southwest Sewer District No. 3 (Postal). I'll make a motion to table, second by Legislator O'Leary. All in favor? Opposed?

LEG. GULDI:
Opposed.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

1296 is tabled (VOTE: 4-1-0-1 Opposed: Legislator Guldi - Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

1543-03 - Implementing Leadership in Energy and Environment Design (LEED) Program for future County construction projects (Viloria-Fisher). Commissioner, Legislator Viloria-Fisher is not here. Could you tell us where things stand? We had tabled it at the last meeting pending some discussions that you were going to have with Legislator Viloria-Fisher about the resolution.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We continue to have reservations about the additional costs that would be associated with it --

LEG. GULDI:
That's not on, Charlie.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Your mike may not be on.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We continue --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

That's it.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We continue to have concerns about the additional costs that will be associated with meeting LEED certification, as well as the fact that the prioritization of projects would not be subject to the real needs of the County but rather based on how LEEDS, which is a non

governmental, not-for-profit agency, based on a rating of LEEDS would establish a priority for County projects.

LEG. GULDI:

If I may, Mr. Chairman?

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Legislator Guldi.

LEG. GULDI:

Yeah, but I thought the bill in its amended form didn't require us to take the ranking and act on it, but required us to simply analyze each of our projects and consider their ranking and apply their design criteria and analysis to our projects; is that not the way the bill has been structured or restructured?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

I'm just -- let me check. The corrected copy of August 8th still contains the provision of the ranking, I don't know if there's been a corrected copy since then.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

I guess let me ask Mr. Ortiz; are you aware of any -- John, are you aware of any more recent amendment?

MR. ORTIZ:

I don't think there's been corrections yet.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Were there supposed to be corrections made or amendments to the bill?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

I mean, I can't speak for Legislator Fisher --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Well, let's say in your discussions with her, did she mention whether there --

LEG. GULDI:

There was supposed to be some discussions and some --

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We've had discussions, we met with LIPA and Legislator Fisher, and there was no -- no change in position.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

No change.

LEG. LINDSAY:

I make a motion to table.

LEG. O'LEARY:

Second.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay, it appears there's not enough votes for approval so a motion by

Legislator Lindsay to table has been made, seconded by Legislator O'Leary. All in favor? Opposed? 1543 is tabled (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa). And we will speak with the sponsor of the bill prior to the next General Meeting in November.

1773-03 - Approving extension of license for the South Ferry Company, Inc. (Caracciolo).

LEG. GULDI:

I thought we were waiting for Budget Review to complete its analysis.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Budget Review, can you tell us where we are with the review of the application?

MR. SPERO:

Yeah, this is an extension of the license which expires at the end of this year.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Yeah.

MR. SPERO:

Okay, and I believe the public hearing is scheduled for the next meeting which is November 18th.

LEG. GULDI:

Motion.

MR. SPERO:

There's no rates involved with this, there's no review by our office.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

There has to be a public hearing. Motion by Legislator O'Leary to table pending the public hearing, seconded by Legislator Guldi. All in favor? Opposed? 1773 is tabled (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

Introductory Resolutions

1811-03 - Amending the 2003 Capital Budget and Program and appropriating funds in connection with strengthening and improving County Roads (CP 5014) (County Executive). I'll make a motion to approve.

LEG. O'LEARY:

Second.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Second by Legislator O'Leary. Commissioner, any comments on this resolution?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We requested this additional \$1 million to -- as a result of the severe winter we had last year to do pavement repairs throughout the County; there's a list of locations.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

A motion and a second has been made. All in favor? Opposed? 1811 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

1812-03 - Amending the 2003 Capital Budget and Program and appropriating funds in connection with traffic signal improvements on various County Roads (CP 5054) (County Executive).

LEG. LINDSAY:

Motion.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Motion by Legislator Lindsay.

LEG. O'LEARY:

Second.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Second by Legislator O'Leary. Commissioner?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We requested the budget be amended in this case in order to meet the demand we have for additional signals and improved signals throughout the County. And with offset money available at the end of the year, we requested this resolution.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

BRO, obviously this is a very important project. We do have some pay-as-you-go monies that Legislator Caracappa has proposed; how does this fit in square with that? And Charlie, you may want to use the other microphone.

LEG. GULDI:

The other one that's -- Charlie, the one in front of you is just simply unplugged because there's no on/off switch on it for exec session; if you plug it back in it will work.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

I should have thought of this on my own.

LEG. GULDI:

We can hire a consultant if you need more help with it.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Mr. Spero?

MR. SPERO:

We've always considered traffic stalls to be a pay-as-you-go project.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Right.

MR. SPERO:

If the additional \$5 million is approved at the November 6th meeting, this resolution could be amended and funded with pay-as-you-go money.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

What I'd like to do is still report this out of committee because it's important, and then at the November 6th we hopefully will --

MR. SPERO:

Ask the County Executive to do a corrected copy for the meeting of the 18th.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Correct, of November.

LEG. GULDI:

Motion to discharge without recommendation.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay, motion to discharge without recommendation. Why don't we make a motion --

LEG. LINDSAY:

Why won't we approve it?

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Let's approve it because of the safety factor, but with the understanding that --

LEG. GULDI:

That's fine.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

-- if and when we approve Legislator Caracappa's resolution on the 6th of November, the County Executive -- and if you could communicate that to the County Executive, Commissioner, to make the appropriate changes to use the pay-as-you-go monies and then we can vote on this at the November 18th meeting.

LEG. O'LEARY:

Motion to approve.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Motion to approve by Legislator O'Leary, second by Legislator Lindsay. All in favor? Opposed? 1812 is --

LEG. LINDSAY:

Before you call the vote.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Yes, Legislator Lindsay.

LEG. LINDSAY:

Do we always use pay-as-you-go for traffic signals?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Not always, no.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Mr. Spero, why don't you --

LEG. LINDSAY:

Because, I mean, it seems to me that that is certainly -- I mean, especially some intersections get expensive and it's quite involved.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Point well taken.

LEG. LINDSAY:

They last more than five years.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Point well taken.

MR. SPERO:

It's a reoccurring project. Traffic signals is one of those items we appropriate funding every year.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

It's a reoccurring project but --

MR. SPERO:

Or it falls under that pay-as-you-go umbrella.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Some of these intersections may require six figure improvements, if you will, and others may only be 70 or 80 for one traffic signal; correct?

LEG. GULDI:

When was the last time we did a traffic signal for 70 or \$80,000?

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Not too many years ago, but that was just a limited intersection.

MR. SPERO:

Well, the funding will be there to do it on a pay-as-you-go basis if it's your choice.

LEG. GULDI:

Okay.

MR. SPERO:

You could do it either way.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

So 1812 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

LEG. LINDSAY:

The 70 or 80,000 was a blinker.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

A blinker, right; a blink of the eye.

LEG. GULDI:
Change the lamps on one for that.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
1813-03 - Appropriating funds in connection with dredging of --

LEG. GULDI:
Napeague.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
-- Napeague Harbor, Town of East Hampton (CP 5200) (County Executive).
Thank you, Legislator Guldi, for that --

LEG. GULDI:
We've got to work on your --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
For your correct pronunciation.

LEG. GULDI:
Your {alcockian} pronunciations.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Very good.

LEG. O'LEARY:
The lack of a second will (inaudible).

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Seconded by the Vice-Chair. All in favor? Opposed?
1813 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).
Good luck with the dredging.

LEG. GULDI:
Thank you.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
1817-03 - Appropriating funds in connection with safety improvements
on CR 105, Cross River Drive at Riverside Drive and NYS Route 25, Town
of Southampton (CP 5075) (County Executive).

LEG. GULDI:
Same motion.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Same motion, same second, same vote.

Approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

1818-03 - Appropriating funds in connection with intersection improvements on CR 16, Smithtown Boulevard, Town of Smithtown (CP 5118) (County Executive). Commissioner, is this a realignment?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

No.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

And this is in Legislator Crecca's District, correct?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

This is for a significant portion of County Road 16; it's from Gibbs Pond Road all the way to 25. This is the engineering for a variety of drainage improvements, intersection improvements along the way, improved pavement section.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay. This is the planning phase, correct?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Yes.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay. And when is the construction phase? The time line chart isn't attached to the reso. I know the Chair of the committee in the past has mentioned those things.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Well, and it's a requirement on projects where there's a million dollars of construction being appropriated.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Right. This is --

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

I don't believe that we have to for that one, I mean, I could stand corrected.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Well, the planning is for 300,000 so normally the planning is about 10% of the project.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Well, certainly the construction costs will exceed one million.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Right.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

But until we are further along in the process --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

You wouldn't know.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

-- we can't develop a construction schedule.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay. Motion by the Vice-Chair, second by Legislator Lindsay.
All in favor? Opposed? 1818 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present:
Legislator Caracappa).

1819-03 - Appropriating funds in connection with the dredging of
Goldsmith's Inlet, Town of Southold (CP 5200) (County Executive).

LEG. GULDI:

Motion.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Motion by the Legislator on the south fork on behalf of the north
fork.

(*Legislator Crecca entered the meeting at 3:23 P.M.*)

LEG. CRECCA:

Second.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Seconded by the tardy Legislator from Smithtown, Legislator Crecca. We
just approved 1818, Legislator Crecca, as you walked in the door, and
knowing how important that is to your particular district.

LEG. CRECCA:

I was here for the vote.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Note that he was here for the vote.

So 1819, motion has been made and seconded. All in favor? Opposed?
1819 is approved (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

1820-03 - Transferring Assessment Stabilization Reserve Funds to the Capital Fund, amending the 2003 Operating Budget, amending the 2003 Capital Budget and Program and appropriating funds for Chemical Bulk Storage Facilities for Sanitary Facilities in Suffolk County Sewer Districts (CP 8178) (County Executive). I think we need some -- an explanation on this, Commissioner, if you could, please.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

The newest DEC requirements provide that we have containment areas in case there is a spill while chemicals are being delivered to any of the treatment facilities. What this will -- we have not had any events of this nature but it is a DEC requirement, so this will fund the work to do it, essentially concrete paths and containment areas.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

BRO, do you have any thoughts on this one?

MR. SPERO:

I see the funding is coming out of Fund 527; I'm just going to check to make sure that funding is available.

MR. SABATINO:

There's just a technical problem, Mr. Chairman. In the fifth RESOLVED clause it has the County Comptroller and the County Treasurer amending the budget, but that's not the way it works, the Legislature amends the budget. So that's going to have to be cleaned up, you know, between now and the time of the vote because you can't delegate your budgetary power to the Comptroller and the Treasurer.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Well, do we want to then table this and wait for the change to be made and then we can discharge it on the 18th?

MR. SABATINO:

That's an option. Also the third RESOLVED clause doesn't appropriate the money, it talks about -- the third RESOLVED clause makes no sense, quite frankly, so you've got two problems.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

All right, let's table the resolution, Commissioner, you can speak to the County Attorney's Office on this.

LEG. O'LEARY:

I make a motion to table.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Motion by Legislator O'Leary to table, second by the Vice-Chair.

All in favor? Opposed? 1820 is tabled (VOTE: 5-0-0-1 Not Present: Legislator Caracappa).

Commissioner, we hope to move on it on the 18th of November, but subject to the changes that our Counsel had requested.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:
Okay, we will clean up the resolution.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Thank you. Legislator Crecca.

LEG. CRECCA:
Mr. Chairman, I just ask if -- I apologize that I was late, I was stuck in the traffic of some County roads on the way here. Actually all State roads, I should say.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
State roads.

LEG. CRECCA:
They were all State roads on the way here, but I ask that my vote be recorded with the majority.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
With the majority, okay, duly noted. Any other business to come before the committee?

Others are free to leave the committee, I just have a couple of questions. I wanted to get an update, Commissioner, on the -- I know the old Infirmary building is a building that this committee and this Legislator and also Mr. Spero over the years has been quite interested in seeing that renovation project move along; could you tell us where things stand with that great WPA building?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:
Before Legislator Guldi and O'Leary leave, I want to thank all my friends and wish them good luck in the next week.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Okay, very good.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:
All my friends that are here.

LEG. GULDI:
I'm still here, Charlie.

LEG. O'LEARY:
I hear you, Charlie.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:
Tedd -- let me ask Tedd to come forward.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Yes, thank you. You know, this is something that has been of an interest to the committee and we're happy to see that we're finally moving forward with the project. So fill us in on where things are, Mr. Godek.

MR. GODEK:
All right. We've taken bids, we have interviewed the contractors on the project, the low bidders, and we are waiting for their submission of bonds and insurance certificates and when those things are submitted we're ready to go; we should be under way some time in November.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
In November, that soon.

MR. GODEK:
Yes.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
Okay. Also is there a PLA involved with this particular project?

MR. GODEK:
Yes, there is.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
And with this project under way, are we timing it such that it works with the calendar of the reconstruction of the Evans K. Griffing Building?

MR. GODEK:
Yes, we are. We're figuring at this point an 18 month construction period which ties in with the Riverhead project. If we can advance that any, and we might be able to, that makes the situation even better.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:
All right, that would be fine, if you could keep us apprised of that because those are two very important projects.

MR. GODEK:

Sure.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Thank you. Commissioner, along the very same roadway, as you know, I have a resolution and I know Legislator O'Leary is the cosponsor for the transference of Yaphank Farm to the Farmland Preservation Program and a key component to that, according to our attentive counsel, is the need to have a survey done so we can delineate the land accordingly as to where the -- we know where the 200 acres are but we need to have a survey to formalize that. You and I had discussed moving forward with the survey and the other week you had mentioned that you were, in fact, were going to do so; can you tell us where that stands, please?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We were reviewing the existing maps to ensure that there was some property between what we have surveys of and what was included here because that affects the accuracy of what's necessary, and Bill has the latest on that.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Thank you.

MR. SHANNON:

Mr. Chairman, we met with Tom Isles from the Planning Department, he came out to the department and went over with us, he had some questions regarding what should and shouldn't go in and he's responding -- he's forwarding us a map outlining the various parcels, at that point we'll be able to prepare or meet some bounds description with a map to include with the resolution, it shouldn't be a problem.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

That would be fine. We're looking at -- we would like November 18th, if it's possible, to have it by then, then we have two meetings in December, but certainly if we can get it done by the 18th that would be appreciated.

MR. SHANNON:

When I receive that --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

You do your best efforts.

MR. SHANNON:

I will.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Yeah, okay. You haven't received it yet from Mr. Isles.

MR. SHANNON:

That's correct, we're waiting for that file map to work from.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

I understand, and he's got a lot on his plate. So we'll be sure to -- I'll be sure to speak with him this week and I want to thank you for

your cooperation on that matter. Additionally, in the Parks Committee which will be up for discussion tomorrow, rather Thursday, we had an issue of encroachment upon parkland out at the Montauk County Airport, the Montauk Airport, and it's surrounded by County owned property. We had asked the Commissioner of Parks to undertake a survey to see, in fact, whether to -- whether, in fact, encroachment has occurred and we had -- I and others had suggested to her to contact both the Public Works Department as well as -- Well, particularly the Public Works Department that keeps a ready-made list of surveyors. So can you tell us what communications has occurred between the Commissioner of Parks and the Public Works Department vis-a-vis a survey.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

I've had some conversations with the Parks Commissioner and she has sent us a memo. They have identified or told me that they would identify a source of funding for it. We're in the process of developing a scope of work to engage a surveyor in order to do that necessary work.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

So at this point, it's -- excuse me. At this point it's in the quote of the Parks Department to come up with the source of funding to pay for this?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Yes, they will pay for it but we're not waiting for that.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay.

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

We are proceeding parallel to --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Very good, very good. And we would expect that to be done when, Commissioner? Not holding you to the day.

MR. SHANNON:

I would say some time at the end of January.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

It's going to take as long as January to get a surveyor?

MR. SHANNON:

Well, we --

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

See, the concern in January will be if there's a lot of snow on the ground we're not going to know whether or not the area has been cut, cleared and the like if, in fact, that's happened.

MR. SHANNON:

Well, what we can do then is we'll advance the aerial photography portion of the project and then we can follow-up with the groundwork. It's going to be two phased; the first phase we'll try to identify property lines on an aerial, but I suspect that once we get to that

point it may be necessary to put stakes in the ground so people can physically see it in the field. So it's going to be a two phased scope of work.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay. I'm sure we'll discuss -- well, I know we'll discuss this in Parks and we'll follow-up in November on that very point.

Anything else to be brought to our committee's attention? We're ready for the winter season; the equipment is all -- the trucks are ready, everything's ready?

COMMISSIONER BARTHA:

Yes, they certainly are and will be. We have our -- usually mid November we have our inspection of the fleet, we'll be ready.

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Very good. Legislator Lindsay?

LEG. LINDSAY:

(Shook head no.)

ACTING CHAIRMAN FOLEY:

Okay. The representative from the Presiding Officer? All right, hearing none, I call the meeting adjourned. Thank you.
