

Statement of Financial Impact on Proposed Suffolk County Legislation

Title of Proposed Resolution:

Adopting Local Law No. -2016, A Local Law to provide designated parking for veterans at County facilities.

Purpose and Intent of Proposed Legislation:

The proposed local law directs the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works to designate two reserved parking spaces for veterans at County facilities. The Commissioner of the Parks Department is likewise directed to establish parking spots in County Parks. The Director of the Suffolk County Veterans Service Agency is tasked with expanding the Suffolk County Veterans Residence Identification Card Program to include the authorization to park in these parking spaces.

Detailed Explanation of Fiscal Impact:

This resolution implicitly assumes that associated costs would be funded within the existing appropriations of the Departments. Signage and pavement markings are the main costs of establishing the parking spaces, which could cost approximately \$200 per spot. Both DPW and Parks have their own sign shops where signs would be constructed. This amendment to the resolution specifies that only parking lots with 30 spots or more will be affected by this resolution.

Based on preliminary estimates by DPW prior to this amendment, spaces would have been established at 56 County parking lots with public access. Assuming that seventy-five percent of these lots have spaces totaling 30 or more, and with the construction of two spots per lot, the total amount of signs would be 84. If spots cost \$200 per spot, this would cost the County approximately \$16,800. The preliminary estimate by the Parks Department shows that there are 15 lots that fit the criteria of this resolution. Assuming approximately \$200 per spot, this would cost the County \$6,000.

There could be additional costs associated with the enforcement and policing of spaces. However, this may be partially offset by revenue generated by the imposition of fines, not to exceed \$100 per violation, upon violators of this law.


Proposed Source of Funding:

The resolution does not authorize a specific source of funding. It does, however, authorize and direct the Commissioners of Parks and DPW to erect the appropriate signage and pavement markings for the proposed parking spaces. Therefore, funding would have to come from the Departments' existing appropriations within the 2016 Adopted Operating Budget.
