**MR. RICHBERG:**

At this time, 10:03, for the record let be it be shown that we are going to open this public hearing. Please be advised to Local Law 27 of 1977, a public hearing must be held in the legislative district in which the property is situated by the Ways and Means Committee and the Legislator from that district. The property is located within the ninth district, and we have set the public hearing as follows: Today, Tuesday, March 31 at 10:00 a.m. in the ninth district at 55 Second Avenue, Suite 7, Brentwood, New York. The time is now 10:03, and no one has shown.

Let us recess for five minutes, for folks to show up, at 10:03 a.m.

Let the record show at 10:10, we are coming back into session, and let the record show that Legislator Monica Martinez has joined us.

We are here to authorize the renewal of lease of the premises located at 1869 Brentwood Road in Brentwood, New York for use by the Department of Health, and Legislator Martinez would like to make a comment.

**LEG. MARTINEZ:**

Yes, thank you. Good morning. I would just like to applaud the county and the landlord of the health center for extending the lease for the health center to remain in Brentwood on Brentwood Road at the address of 1869 Brentwood Road. I think it's very important that the health center remains there, as it has been there for decades, and our community attends on a regular basis, the clinic. Moving it outside the district would only impede the health of our residents, and when I was approached with the possibility of it being moved, I had several conversations with the county and HRH to assure that that center remains here, and it did, so I am very thankful for that.

Also, not only am I thankful that it's staying in there but it's also helping our economic development in the district. It is located in a shopping center where patients either go shopping prior to going to their appointment or after, so again I am thankful that it's remaining here in Brentwood.
