BOND RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,000,000 BONDS TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COST OF THE HEALTH AND SPORTS FACILITY – EASTERN CAMPUS (CP 2120.310)

The object or purpose for which the bonds are authorized for a portion of the cost of the Health and Sports Facility – Eastern Campus, at an estimated maximum cost of \$21,750,000.

The amount of obligations authorized to be issued is \$2,000,000, in addition to the \$8,875,000 in obligations heretofore authorized; State Aid in the amount of \$2,000,000 is expected to be received.

The period of probable usefulness of the bonds is fifteen (15) years, computed from October 25, 2012, the date of issuance of the first obligations issued therefrom pursuant to Bond Resolution No. 199-2011.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Suffolk County Legislature has passed Introductory Resolution No. 1050-2017 “A Local Law Amending County Restrictions on Outdoor Restraint of Pets” which law strengthens regulations on the outdoor restraint of pets and improves the law’s enforcement provisions to protect pets including prohibiting the restraining of pets outdoors between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. and when the temperature is below 32 degrees or above 90 degrees Fahrenheit. This law amends the penalty structure by changing violations to an unclassified misdemeanor and adding imprisonment and forfeiture of the animal for multiple violations.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Suffolk County Legislature has passed Introductory Resolution No. 1094-2017 “A Local Law to Increase Certain Administrative Fees for the Department of Probation” which law increases the monthly probation administrative fee for individuals convicted of a crime other than Vehicle Traffic Law Article 31 from \$60 to \$70; presentence investigation fee from \$375 to \$450; and the court-ordered drug test fee per test, from \$12.50 to \$15.

LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Suffolk County Legislature has passed Introductory Resolution No. 1118-2017 “A Local Law to Increase the Penalties for Illegal Dumping in Suffolk County” which law adds construction or demolition debris, hazardous materials and hazardous waste to the type of waste materials that are prohibited from being deposited on any County highway right-of-way or property. This law creates a separate penalty structure for dumping construction waste, hazardous materials and hazardous waste and makes such dumping punishable as an unclassified misdemeanor and subjects individuals to a fine not to exceed \$10,000 and corporations to a fine not to exceed \$15,000 and/or one year’s imprisonment for each offense. In addition, this law imposes up to one year’s imprisonment and increases corporate fines from \$5,000 to \$15,000, for dumping materials other than construction or demolition debris, hazardous materials or hazardous waste.
