HUNTINGTON, NY –Suffolk County Legislator Steve Stern (D-Huntington) 16th LD, awarded a proclamation to Ken Rosenblum, upon his retirement as Director of the Veterans' and Servicemembers' Rights Clinic at the Touro Law Center. Mr. Rosenblum served five years on active duty as a United States Army JAG Officer, served a tour in Vietnam, and worked as a court-martial prosecutor, war crimes investigator and military judge. He is a recipient of the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal and the Army Commendation Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster.

He served as Deputy Chief of the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office District Court Bureau, Managing Attorney of the Suffolk County Attorney's Office and as Commissioner of the Suffolk County Department of Consumer Affairs.

Mr. Rosenblum joined Touro Law Center in 1990, serving in numerous capacities and was named Director of the Veterans' and Servicemembers' Rights Clinic in 2013. Under his direction, the Clinic has assisted hundreds of veterans in securing benefits, provided support and understanding and helped train the next generation of advocates. He assisted with the formulation and implementation of the "Housing Our Homeless Heroes Act," to create housing and provide services to the brave men and women who sacrificed so much to protect our great nation. In retirement, he plans on continuing his work for our veterans and their families.

"I am honored to join with my colleagues on the Veterans Committee to recognize and thank Ken Rosenblum for his life-long service and dedication to our country and to those who serve," Legislator Stern said.
