





Since 1996, Herstory has taught thousands of heretofore silenced Long Islanders to transform their personal stories into intensely moving narratives that connect individual experiences with larger social issues. Working in English and Spanish in partnership with colleges, universities, schools and nonprofit organizations, Herstory gives voice to the most isolated and vulnerable populations on Long Island: women in prison, in homeless shelters, women on disability and welfare, domestic workers, Asian, Hispanic and Caribbean immigrants, pregnant and parenting teens and, more recently, to young men and boys – including students caught in the school-to-prison pipeline. Herstory currently offers 12-17 weekly workshops on Long Island year-round, 3 in jail-based settings, 2-4 in Spanish, 5-10 in affiliation with colleges, universities, and public schools.

IRS Phone Scams & Emails Persist: What You Need to Know!

- **The IRS and other government agencies will never:**
 - Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill
 - Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe
 - Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card
 - Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone
 - Threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.
- Scammers will often ask for personal information which can be used in an identity theft crime. Personal information including Social Security numbers and bank account information should never be given to telephone callers or through email.
- Never give out personal information when receiving an unsolicited call or email, and always be suspicious of those who ask to keep the conversation private.
- The safest thing to do is always to say “no” and hang up.
- The IRS does not initiate taxpayer communications through email. Unsolicited email claiming to be from the IRS, or from an IRS-related component such as EFTPS, should be reported to the IRS at phishing@irs.gov.
 - **Do not** click on attachments or links within an unsolicited email claiming to come from the as they may download a malicious computer virus onto your computer.
