RESOLUTION NO. 667 -2010, AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING A GULF OIL SPILL EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

WHEREAS, Suffolk County is dedicated to protecting the environment; and

WHEREAS, the County's marine environments, particularly along its south shore, are vulnerable to pollution; and

WHEREAS, pollution in the County's waters and on the shores negatively impact the County's ecosystem and economy; and

WHEREAS, the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico has caused extensive pollution from crude oil and the chemical dispersants being used to control the spill, devastating sensitive wetlands in Louisiana and crippling that State's fishing industry; and

WHEREAS, experts say the oil and chemicals from the spill may travel around the Florida peninsula and enter the Gulf Stream, carrying the pollution up the Eastern seaboard; and

WHEREAS, the risk that Long Island will be affected by the oil spill in the Gulf will increase during the upcoming hurricane season; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County needs to plan for a quick and appropriate response should oil and other pollutants from the Gulf of Mexico reach our waters; now, therefore be it

- 1st RESOLVED, that the following County officers shall convene immediately for the purpose of formulating Suffolk County's emergency response plan to address pollution from the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico, should it reach the County's shores, as well as any potential impacts on the County's economy, or the health, welfare and safety of County residents in connection thereto:
 - 1.) the Commissioner of the Department of Environment and Energy, or his or her designee, who shall serve as Chairman of the Team;
 - 2.) the Commissioner of the Department of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services, or his or her designee;
 - 3.) the Commissioner of the Suffolk County Police Department, or his or her designee;
 - 4.) the Sheriff, or his or her designee;
 - 5.) the Commissioner of the Parks Department for the Park Police, or his or her designee;
 - 6.) the Commissioner of the Department of Health Services, or his or her designee;

- 7.) the Commissioner of the Department of Public Works, or his or her designee;
- 8.) the Commissioner of the Department of Economic Development and Workforce Housing, or his or her designee; and
- 9.) the Director of the Department of Planning, or his or her designee;

and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, that such plan will address coordination with the federal, state and other local governments; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that the officials shall submit the completed response plan to the County Executive and the County Legislature within twenty (20) days of the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
