

**RESOLUTION NO. 150 -2012, TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY
OF RELOCATING PATCHOGUE'S CARNEGIE LIBRARY TO
THE SIXTH DISTRICT COURT PROPERTY**

WHEREAS, Andrew Carnegie, the famous industrialist and philanthropist, donated millions of dollars for the construction of libraries across America in the early 20th century; and

WHEREAS, Andrew Carnegie donated the funds to build a library in Patchogue, which opened in 1908; and

WHEREAS, Patchogue's original Carnegie Library was 2,300 square feet and designed in the neoclassical style; and

WHEREAS, the Carnegie building served as Patchogue's library until 1981; and

WHEREAS, Patchogue's Carnegie Library building is still standing on Lake Street, one of the two remaining Carnegie Libraries on Long Island; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Patchogue wishes to preserve the Carnegie Library but it needs a new location on which to site the building; and

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk owns property at the Sixth District Court, 150 West Main Street, Patchogue, that could accommodate the library structure while the Village of Patchogue retains ownership and provides maintenance; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of Suffolk County to preserve the historic Carnegie Library building in Patchogue; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the Suffolk County Department of Public Works ("Department") is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to study the feasibility of relocating Patchogue's Carnegie Library to the Sixth District Court property, 150 West Main Street, Patchogue, New York; and be it further

2nd RESOLVED, the Department's study will determine the precise location where the Carnegie Library would be sited and how insurance and maintenance responsibilities would be allocated between the County and the Village of Patchogue; and be it further

3rd RESOLVED, that in conducting this study, the Department will consult with the Office of Court Administration; and be it further


4th RESOLVED, that the County Attorney's Office will cooperate with the Department in performing the study and determine the legal issues that need to be addressed to effectuate the library's relocation; and be it further

5th RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF

RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
