

**RESOLUTION NO. 362 -2013, DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT  
OF PUBLIC WORKS TO STUDY THE S62 AND 5A BUS  
ROUTES**

**WHEREAS**, many Suffolk County residents rely on public transportation to travel to jobs, shopping areas and other destinations; and

**WHEREAS**, Suffolk County Transit Bus Routes S62 and 5A operate from Hauppauge to Riverhead and Port Jefferson to Middle Island, respectively; and

**WHEREAS**, Routes S62 and 5A intersect to allow travel to different points in central and eastern Suffolk County; and

**WHEREAS**, riders are complaining that the arrival and departure times on these routes make timely transfers difficult; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Public Works should study these routes to determine the extent of the problem and devise solutions to improve the operation of the routes for riders; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that the Department of Public Works is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to conduct a study of the Suffolk County Transit Routes S62 and 5A to determine if the schedules for these routes are operating efficiently and determine which changes should be made to the bus schedules to facilitate timely transfer between routes; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, that the study shall evaluate the current system and the benefits and costs of changing stops and/or schedule times of the S62 and 5A Bus Routes; and be it further

**3rd RESOLVED**, that the Department shall complete this study and present a written report of its findings and recommendations to the County Executive and each member of the County Legislature no later than 120 days subsequent to the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

**4th RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20), (21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
