**RESOLUTION NO. -2013, DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT  
OF PARKS, RECREATION AND CONSERVATION TO  
DEVELOP A PLAN FOR THE CARE AND USE OF THE HILDA  
LINDLEY HOUSE IN MONTAUK COUNTY PARK**

**WHEREAS**, the Hilda Lindley House was the home of Hilda Lindley, a champion of Montauk County Park, where the house is located; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lindley House was originally built by the United States Army as a fire control station as part of a national fire-control system along the coasts of the United States to spot enemy submarines, ships and other craft; and

**WHEREAS**, the house was subsequently sold by the Army to the Lindley family as surplus; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lindley House is in need of significant repairs if it is ever to be accessible to the people of Suffolk County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation should develop a plan for the care, maintenance and use of the Lindley House in a manner consistent with the County's plan for Montauk County Park; now, therefore be it

**1st RESOLVED**, that the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation ("Department") is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to develop a plan for the care, maintenance and use of the Lindley House in conformance with the Master plan for Montauk County Park; and be it further

**2nd RESOLVED**, that the Department shall develop this plan in consultation with the Department of Public Works and will include a structural analysis of the building with associated estimates of the costs necessary to return the building to a state suitable for public use; and be it further

**3rd RESOLVED**, that the Department shall complete the care, maintenance and use plan for the Lindley House within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this resolution; and be it further

**4th RESOLVED**, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) lead agency, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(20),(21) and (27) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6 NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management and information collection, and the Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
