RESOLUTION NO. 780-2014, ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$21,000 FROM THE STATE OF NEW YORK OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR A COMMUNITY OVERDOSE PREVENTION PROGRAM WITH 100% SUPPORT

WHEREAS, the State of New York Office of the Attorney General has made available \$21,000 in Federal and State Asset Forfeiture funding for the Suffolk County Police Department to purchase Naloxone Kits to be distributed to sworn officers for administration to victims of acute opioid overdose in an attempt to prevent death; and

WHEREAS, Naloxone is used in the event of an acute opioid overdose to mitigate the effects of the opioid and prevent the death of the victim; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk County Police Department has been using Naloxone since 2012 and has found it to be an effective tool against death from opioid overdose; and

WHEREAS, the contract period for the program will be from June 3, 2014 through December 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, said grant funds totaling \$21,000 have not been included in the 2014 Suffolk County Operating Budget; now, therefore be it

1st RESOLVED, that the County Comptroller and County Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to accept and appropriate said grant funds as follows:
