**RESOLUTION NO. 1106 -2014, PERMITTING THE VILLAGE OF WEST HAMPTON DUNES TO PURCHASE FUEL FROM THE COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of West Hampton Dunes (Village) wishes to purchase fuel from the County under the County's Fuel Management/Preventive Maintenance Inventory Control System which was authorized by Resolution No. 1233-1997; and

**WHEREAS**, the County agrees to provide the services requested by the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village agrees to pay for all costs associated with retrofitting their vehicles to conform to the County's Fuel Management/Preventative Maintenance Inventory Control System; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village will reimburse the County for the cost of fuel used by their vehicles, in addition to a fifteen percent (15%) administrative fee; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village would like to enter into another ten (10) year agreement for the purchase of fuel; and

**WHEREAS**, the County and the Village are permitted to enter into joint cooperation Agreements; now, therefore be it

**1<sup>st</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the Village at their own expense, will conform with the County's Fuel Management/Preventive Maintenance Inventory Control System and reimburse the County for the cost of fuel used by their vehicles, plus a fifteen percent (15%) administrative fee; and be it further

**2<sup>nd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that the County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Executive, or his designee, to execute any and all agreements with the Village on behalf of the County of Suffolk providing for their participation in the above referenced program; and be it further

**3<sup>rd</sup>** **RESOLVED**, that this Legislature being the lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), New York Environmental Conservation Law Article 8, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Vol. 6 of the New York Code of Rules and Regulations (NYCRR) Section 617.5 (c) (20) (27) in that the resolution concerns purchase or sale of furnishings, equipment and supplies, other than land, radioactive material, pesticides, herbicides or other hazardous materials and adoption of a local legislative decision in connection with the same; as a Type II action, the Legislature has no further responsibility under SEQRA.
